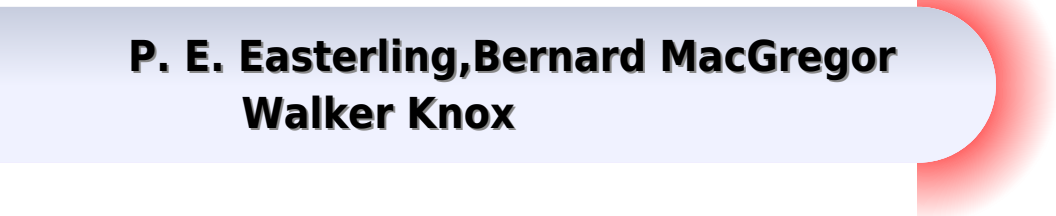

Tragedy and Civilization Charles Segal, 1999 Drawing on comprehensive analyses of all of Sophocles plays on structuralist anthropology and on other extensive work on myth and tragedy Charles Segal examines Sophocles both as a great dramatic poet and as a serious thinker He shows how Sophoclean tragedy reflects the human condition in its constant and tragic struggle for order and civilized life against the ever present threat of savagery and chaotic violence both within society and within the individual *Tragedy and Civilization* begins with a study of these themes and then proceeds to detailed discussions of each of the seven plays For this edition Segal also provides a new preface discussing recent developments in the study of Sophocles Greek Literature P. E. Easterling, Bernard MacGregor Walker Knox, 1989 The Cambridge History of Classical Literature Volume 1 offers a comprehensive survey of Greek literature from Homer to end of the period of stable Graeco Roman civilization in the third century A D It embodies the advances made by recent classical scholarship and pays particular attention to texts that have become known in modern times After its success in hardcover this volume is now being issued in four paperback parts providing individual texts on early Greek poetry Greek drama philosophy history and oratory and on the literature of the Hellenistic period and the Empire A chapter on books and readers in the Greek world concludes Part 4 Each part has its own appendix of authors and works a list of works cited and an index Publisher s description

Opera From the Greek Michael Ewans, 2017-07-05 Michael Ewans explores how classical Greek tragedy and epic poetry have been appropriated in opera through eight selected case studies These range from Monteverdi s *Il ritorno d Ulisse in patria* drawn from Homer s *Odyssey* to Mark Antony Turnage s Greek based on Sophocles s *Oedipus the King* Choices have been based on an understanding that the relationship between each of the operas and their Greek source texts raise significant issues involving an examination of the process by which the librettist creates a new text for the opera and the crucial insights into the nature of the drama that are bestowed by the composer s musical setting Ewans examines the issues through a comparative analysis of significant divergences of plot character and dramatic strategy between source text libretto and opera *Looking at Ajax* David Stuttard, 2019-05-02 *Ajax* is perhaps the earliest of Sophocles tragedies yet the issues at its heart remain profoundly resonant today Set in the Greek encampment during the siege of Troy it traces not just the story of a respected war hero s mental breakdown but like Sophocles *Antigone* the treatment of an enemy s remains and the management of his memory Pitting the fate of the individual against not just his own community but the cosmic world of the divine it explores questions of loyalty and power compassion and control integrity and political expediency and ultimately what it is to be human In Antiquity the fate of *Ajax* fascinated writers and artists alike Today it has assumed a new importance with Sophocles play being used to help treat military veterans suffering from PTSD This collection of 12 essays by leading academics from across the UK US and Ireland draws together many of the themes explored in *Ajax* from how Sophocles exploits audiences awareness of mythology and visual arts to questions of politics and religion staging and

Tragic Bodies Nancy Worman, 2020-12-10 Winner of the PROSE Award 2022 for Classics This book argues for a new way of reading tragedy that attends to how bodies in the ancient plays pivot between subject and object person and thing living and dead and so serve as vehicles for confronting the edges of the human At the same time it explores the ways in which Greek tragedy pulls up close to human bodies examining their physical edges their surfaces and parts their coverings or nakedness and their postures and orientations Drawing on and advancing the latest interplays of posthumanism and materialism in relation to classical literature Nancy Worman shows how this tragic enactment may seem to emphasize the human body but in effect does something quite different Greek drama instead often treats the body as a thing that has the status and implications associated with other objects such as a cloak an urn or a toy for a dog *Tragic Bodies* urges attention to key scenes in Greek tragedy that foreground bodily identifiers as semiotic materializing This occurs when signs with weighty symbolic resonance distil out on the dramatic stage as concrete sites for contention and conflation orchestrated through proximity contact and sensory dynamics Reading the dramatic script in this way pursues the felt knowledge at the body's edges that tragic representation affords a consideration attuned to how bodies register at tragedy's unique intersections where directive and figurative language combine to highlight visual tactile and aural details
