

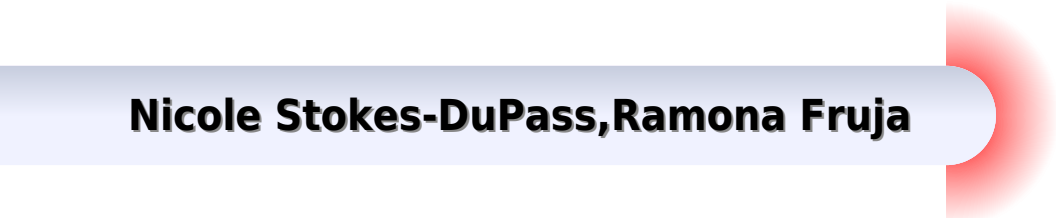

Transnational Citizenship Across the Americas Ulla Berg, Robyn Rodriguez, 2015-12-22 Mass migrations diasporas dual citizenship arrangements neoliberal economic reforms and global social justice movements have in recent decades produced shifting boundaries and meanings of citizenship within and beyond the Americas In migrant receiving countries this has raised questions about extending rights to newcomers In migrant sending countries it has prompted states to search for new ways to include their emigrant citizens into the nation state This book situates new practices of immigrant and emigrant citizenship and the policies that both facilitate and delimit them in a broader political economic context It shows how the ability of people to act as transnational citizens is mediated by inequalities along the axes of gender race nationality and class both in and between source and destination countries resulting in a plethora of possible relations between states and migrants The volume provides cross disciplinary and theoretically engaging discussions as well as empirically diverse case studies from countries in Latin America and the Caribbean that have been transformed into emigrant states in recent years offering new concepts and theory for the study of transnational citizenship This book was originally published as a special issue of *Identities Global Studies in Culture and Power*

Citizenship, Belonging, and Nation-States in the Twenty-First Century Nicole Stokes-DuPass, Ramona Fruja, 2017-07-15 Citizenship Belonging and Nation States in the Twenty First Century contributes to the scholarship on citizenship and integration by examining belonging in an array of national settings and by demonstrating how nation states continue to matter in citizenship analysis Citizenship policies are positioned as state mechanisms that actively shape the integration outcomes and experiences of belonging for all who reside within the nation state This edited volume contributes an alternative to the promotion of post national models of membership and emphasizes that the most fundamental facet of citizenship a status of recognition in relationship to a nation state need not be left in the relic galleries of an allegedly outdated political past This collection offers a timely contribution both theoretical and empirical to understanding citizenship nationalism and belonging in contexts that feature not only rapid change but also levels of entrenchment in ideological and historical legacies

Parker, 2025-02-10 A nuanced take on how carceral expansions are changing labor and social life In *Carceral Citizens* anthropologist Caroline M Parker offers an ethnographic portrait of therapeutic communities in Puerto Rico the oldest colony in the Americas As nonprofits nested within the carceral state therapeutic communities serve as reeducation and recovery centers for the mostly male drug offenders who serve out their sentences engaged in manual labor and prayer The most surprising aspect of these centers however is that their graduates often remain long after the completion of their term working as self appointed peer counselors in a mixture of volunteer and low wage positions Parker seeks to explain this dynamic by showing how in these therapeutic communities criminalized men find new and meaningful ways of living in the shadow of the prison Through their participation in the day to day functioning of the centers they discover and cultivate alternative forms of belonging livelihood and citizenship despite living within the restrictions of the carceral state Situating her study against the backdrop of Puerto Rico's colonial history and with findings that extend across Latin America Parker challenges common assumptions about confinement labor and rehabilitation By delving into lives shaped by the convergence of imperialism the carceral state and self help she offers a fresh understanding of the transformations of labor and social life brought about by mass incarceration

Alien Nation Elliott Young, 2014 Young traces the pivotal century of Chinese migration to the Americas beginning with the 1840s at the start of the coolie trade and ending during World War II This book is the first transnational history of Chinese migration to the Americas By focusing on the fluidity and complexity of border crossings throughout the Western Hemisphere Young shows us how Chinese migrants constructed alternative communities and identities through these transnational pathways Provided by publisher Race and Transnationalism in the Americas Benjamin Bryce, David M. his rhetoric for different audiences in his speeches and writings In *Vicente Ximenes LBJ's Great Society and Mexican American Civil Rights Rhetoric* Michelle Hall Kells elucidates Ximenes's achievement through a rhetorical history of his career as an activist Kells draws on Ximenes's extensive archive of speeches reports articles and oral interviews to present the activist's rhetorical history and begins each chapter with an excerpt from the collection that showcases Ximenes's ability to negotiate multiple public spheres Exploring Ximenes's legacy against the backdrop of the Cold War era Kells's analyses illustrate how Ximenes effectively agitated for open inclusive and pluralist democracy at regional and national levels After a discussion of Ximenes's early life the author focuses on his career as an activist examining Ximenes's leadership in several key civil rights events including the historic 1967 White House cabinet committee hearings on Mexican American Affairs and highlighting his role in advancing Mexican Americans and Latinos from social marginalization to greater representation in national politics Kells concludes by reflecting on the later years of Ximenes's life and his contributions to the post World War II civil rights movement *Vicente Ximenes LBJ's Great Society and Mexican American Civil Rights Rhetoric* shows us a remarkable man who dedicated the majority of his life to public service using rhetoric to mobilize activists for change at the grassroots level as well as at the highest levels of government to secure civil rights advances for his fellow Mexican Americans
