Baumgartner,2013-04-24 The catalytic properties of many enzymes depend on the participation of vitamins as obligatory cofactors Vitamin B12 cobalamin and folic acid folate deficiencies in infants and children classically present with megaloblastic anemia and are often accompanied by neurological signs A number of rare inborn errors of cobalamin and folate absorption transport cellular uptake and intracellular metabolism have been delineated and identification of disease causing mutations has improved our ability to diagnose and treat many of these conditions Two inherited defects in biotin
