Simmons, 2021-12-22 Renowned environmental historian I G Simmons synthesizes detailed research into the landscape history of the coastal area of Lincolnshire between Boston and Skegness and its hinterland of Tofts Low Grounds and Fen as far as the Wolds With many excellent illustrations Simmons chronicles the ways in which this low coast backed by a wet fen has been managed to display a set of landscapes which have significant differences that contradict the common terminology of uniformity calling the area flat or referring to everywhere from Cleethorpes to King's Lynn as the fens These usually labeled flat areas of East Lincolnshire between Mablethorpe and Boston are in fact a mosaic of subtly different landscapes They have become that way largely due to the human influences derived from agriculture and industry Between the beginning of Norman rule and the advent of pumped drainage a number of significant changes took place The author has accumulated information from Roman times until the beginnings of fossil fuel powered drainage bringing together both scientific data and documentary evidence including medieval and early modern documents from the National Archive Lincolnshire Archives Bethlem Hospital and Magdalen College Oxford to explore the little known archives of regional interest

Chronology and Evolution within the Mesolithic of North-West Europe Philippe Crombé, Joris Sergeant, Mark Van Strydonck, 2020-06-12 Since its development in 1949 radiocarbon dating has increasingly been used in prehistoric research in order to get a better grip on the chronology of sites cultures and environmental changes Refinement of the dating sampling and calibration methods has continuously created new and challenging perspectives for absolute dating In these proceedings the focus lies on the contribution of carbon 14 dates in current Mesolithic research in

North West Europe Altogether 40 papers dealing with radiocarbon dates from 15 different countries are presented Major themes are the typo technological evolution of lithic and bone industries changes in settlement patterns burial practices demography and subsistence human impact on the Mesolithic environment and the neolithisation process Some papers also deal with more methodological aspects of carbon 14 dating e g calculation of various reservoir effects the use of cumulative calibrated probability distributions and related techniques e g stable isotope analysis for palaeodiet reconstruction

Amkreutz, 2013-12-19 The adoption of agriculture is one of the major developments in human history Archaeological studies have demonstrated that the trajectories of Neolithisation in Northwest Europe were diverse This book presents a study into the archaeology of the communities involved in the process of Neolithisation in the Lower Rhine Area 5500-2500 cal BC It elucidates the role played by the indigenous communities in relation to their environmental context and in view of the changes that becoming Neolithic brought about This work brings together a comprehensive array of excavated archaeological sites in the Lower Rhine Area Their analysis shows that the succession of Late Mesolithic Swifterbant culture, Hazendonk group and Vlaardingen culture societies represents a continuous long term tradition of inhabitation of the wetlands and wetland margins of this area forming a culturally continuous record of communities in the transition to agriculture After demonstrating the diversity of the Mesolithic the subsequent developments regarding Neolithisation are studied from an indigenous perspective Foregrounding the relationship between local communities and the dynamic wetland landscape the study shows that the archaeological evidence of regional inhabitation points to long term flexible behaviour and pragmatic decisions being made concerning livelihood, food economy and mobility This disposition also influenced how the novel elements of Neolithisation were incorporated Animal husbandry, crop cultivation and sedentism were an addition to the existing broad spectrum economy but were incorporated within a set of integrative strategies For the interpretation of Neolithisation this study offers a complementary approach to existing research Instead of arguing for a short transition based on the economic importance of domesticates and cultigens at sites this study emphasises the persistent traditions of the communities involved New elements instead of bringing about radical changes are shown to be attuned to existing hunter-gatherer practices By documenting indications of the mentality of the inhabitants of the wetlands it is demonstrated that their mindset remained essentially Mesolithic for millennia This book is accompanied by a separate 422 page volume containing the appendices These constitute a comprehensive inventory of 159 mostly excavated archaeological sites in the Lower Rhine Area

Hunters, Fishers and Foragers in Wales Malcolm Lillie, 2015-07-31 Malcolm Lillie presents a major new holistic

appraisal of the evidence for the Mesolithic occupation of Wales The story begins with a discourse on the Palaeolithic background In order to set the entire Mesolithic period into its context subsequent chapters follow a sequence from the palaeoenvironmental background through a consideration of the use of stone tools settlement patterning and evidence for subsistence strategies and the range of available resources Less obvious aspects of hunter forager and subsequent hunter fisher forager groups include the arenas of symbolism ritual and spirituality that would have been embedded in everyday life The author here endeavors to integrate an evaluation of these aspects of Mesolithic society in developing a social narrative of Mesolithic lifeways throughout the text in an effort to bring the past to life in a meaningful and considered way The term hunter fisher foragers implies a particular combination of subsistence activities but whilst some groups may well have integrated this range of economic activities into their subsistence strategies others may not have The situation in coastal areas of Wales in relation to subsistence settlement and even spiritual matters would not necessarily be the same as in upland areas even when the same groups moved between these zones in the landscape The volume concludes with a discussion of the theoretical basis for the shift away from the exploitation of wild resources towards the integration of domesticates into subsistence strategies i e the shift from food procurement to food production and assesses the context of the changes that occurred as human groups re orientated their socioeconomic political and ritual beliefs in light of newly available resources influences from the continent and ultimately their social condition at the time of transition

Dwelling on the edge of the Neolithic Gary Robert Nobles, 2017-02-14 This volume presents a detailed spatial analysis of the sites of Keinsmerbrug Mienakker and Zeewijk These Late Neolithic settlement sites define the westernmost edge of the Corded Ware Culture c 2900 2300 cal BC The people took part in a broad spectrum of activities hunting gathering fishing agriculture animal husbandry and artisan crafts They maintained their regional traditions while dwelling on the edge of this Neolithic cultural group The study depicts Neolithic households as highly mobile with sedentary and seasonal settlements The patterns that emerge from the in depth spatial analysis of material distributions indicate the presence of spatially bound locations for specific activities This structuring of space further supports the identification of various dwelling structures Neolithic monumentality is for the first time identified within the Dutch coastal wetlands The biographical perspective underlines the ephemeral nature of the divide between the place of the living and the place of the ancestors
