Understanding Jim Crow David Pilgrim, 2015-11-25 For many people especially those who came of age after landmark civil rights legislation was passed it is difficult to understand what it was like to be an African American living under Jim Crow segregation in the United States Most young Americans have little or no knowledge about restrictive covenants literacy tests poll taxes lynchings and other oppressive features of the Jim Crow racial hierarchy Even those who have some familiarity with the period may initially view racist segregation and injustices as mere relics of a distant shameful past A proper understanding of race relations in this country must include a solid knowledge of Jim Crow how it emerged what it was like how it ended and its impact on the culture *Understanding Jim Crow* introduces readers to the Jim Crow Museum of Racist Memorabilia a collection of more than ten thousand contemptible collectibles that are used to engage visitors in intense and intelligent discussions about race race relations and racism The items are offensive They were meant to be offensive The items in the Jim Crow Museum served to dehumanize blacks and legitimized patterns of prejudice discrimination and segregation Using racist objects as teaching tools seems counterintuitive and quite frankly needlessly risky Many Americans are already apprehensive discussing race relations especially in settings where their ideas are challenged The museum and this book exist to help overcome our collective trepidation and reluctance to talk about race Fully illustrated and with context provided by the museum's founder and director David Pilgrim *Understanding Jim Crow* is both a grisly tour through America's past and an auspicious starting point for racial understanding and healing

buffoonish minstrel the subhuman savage the loyal and contented mammy and Tom and the menacing razor toting coon and brute Malcolm X and James Baldwin both refused to eat watermelon in front of white people They were aware of the jokes and other stories about African Americans stealing watermelons fighting over watermelons even being transformed into watermelons Did racial stories influence the actions of white fraternities and sororities who dressed in blackface and mocked black culture or employees who hung nooses in their workplaces What stories did the people who refer to Serena Williams and other dark skinned athletes as apes or baboons hear Is it possible that a white South Carolina police officer who shot a fleeing black man had never heard stories about scary black men with straight razors or other weapons Antiblack stories still matter Watermelons Nooses and Straight Razors uses images from the Jim Crow Museum the nation s largest publicly accessible collection of racist objects These images are evidence of the social injustice that Martin Luther King Jr referred to as a boil that can never be cured so long as it is covered up but must be exposed to the light of human conscience and the air of national opinion before it can be cured Each chapter concludes with a story from the author s journey challenging the integrity of racial narratives

The Day the Klan Came to Town Bill Campbell,2021-08-17 The year is 1923 The Ku Klux Klan is at the height of its power in the US as membership swells into the millions and they expand beyond their original southern borders As they grow so do their targets As they continue their campaigns of terror against African Americans their list now includes Catholics and Jews southern and eastern Europeans all in the name of white supremacy But they are no longer considered a terrorist organization By adding the messages of moral decency family values and temperance the Klan has slapped on a thin veneer of respectability and has become a civic organization attracting ordinary citizens law enforcement and politicians to their particular brand of white Anglo Saxon and Protestant Americanism Pennsylvania enthusiastically joined that wave That was when the Grand Dragon of Pennsylvania decided to display the Klan s newfound power in a show of force He chose a small town outside of Pittsburgh named after Andrew Carnegie a small unassuming borough full of Catholics and Jews the perfect place to teach these immigrants a lesson Some thirty thousand members of the Klan gathered from as far as Kentucky for Karnegie Day After initiating new members they armed themselves with torches and guns to descend upon the town to show them exactly what Americanism was all about The Day the Klan Came to Town is a fictionalized retelling of the riot focusing on a Sicilian immigrant Primo Salerno He is not a leader he s a man with a troubled past He was pulled from the sulfur mines of Sicily as a teen to fight in the First World War Afterward he became the focus of a local fascist and was forced to emigrate to the United States He doesn t want to fight but feels that he may have no choice The entire town needs him and indeed everybody to make a stand

People's Republic of Neverland Robb Johnson,2020-10-01 There once was a time when teachers and communities were able to exercise democratic control over their schools Now that power has been taken away both centralised and privatised under the guise of reform There is a forgotten history of the time before reform and within it a bright horizon is visible reachable only if educators and society at

large can learn the lessons of the past Robb Johnson entered the classroom as a new teacher in the 1980s and has spent a lifetime alongside his pupils encouraging both creativity and a healthy distrust of authority This book is both memoir and polemic a celebration of children s innate desire to learn share cooperate and play as well as a critique of bureaucratic interference Johnson details how we ended up with the contemporary mass education systems and why they continually fail to give children what they need Combining practical experience as a teacher with detailed pedagogical knowledge and a characteristic playful style Johnson is both court chronicler and jester imparting information and creatively admonishing the self important figureheads of the reform agenda This book considers how schools and education relate to the wider society in which they are located and how they relate to the particular needs and abilities of the people who experience them It shows that schools and education are contested spaces that need to be reclaimed from the state and turned into places where people can grow not up not old but as individuals It offers alternative ways of running classrooms schools and perhaps even society

McCoy,2023-11-16 Contested Valor is a challenging examination of the use and status of black Marines in United States military service during the Cold War era These pioneering men experienced contested military integration as well as multiple forms of institutional and social opposition which called their humanity manhood and rights to full citizenship into question Efforts to undermine their service compromised their right to be counted among the elite and sidelined their story to the fringes of Marine Corps and U S history Cameron McCoy describes the factors and pressures leading to the racial turbulence that surfaced in the Marine Corps from the end of World War II through Vietnam and the measures taken by civilian and Marine officials to maintain and restore organizational integrity based on a foundation of white supremacy He examines the psychological effects of institutionalized racism on African American Marines during the Vietnam era and the emergence of a new generation of black men unwilling to submit to the traditions of a Jim Crow Marine Corps By exploring the realities American society constructed about black Marines this work calls attention to the diverse ways in which these men coped within a strict

prejudiced organization and found greater purpose as U S Marines despite an embattled image Contested Valor weaves the experiences of black Americans in the armed forces into the larger tapestry of the American racist past and aptly captures the dilemmas triumphs and pitfalls that the first African American Marines encountered during the contentious eras of World War II Korea and Vietnam McCoy explores the creation of organizational policies designed to minimize their footprint as U S Marines until the social experiment of military integration faded and illustrates the discriminatory practices that further delegitimized their wartime reputation McCoy demonstrates that black Marines absence from the historical record has been compounded by the negligence and oversight of past historians as the Marine Corps reckons with its racist past and its first black Marines

McPherson,2024 In The Afterlife of Race Lionel McPherson demystifies the Western concept of race and reframes race ideology in America as a caste device that sponsors absurd pretexts for inherited slavery enforced segregation and the wilful nonrepair of historical injustice This reframing paves the way for an anti caste vision of social equality that emphasizes the moral importance of Black American national specificity not general antiracism identity politics or diversity of color The result is a non racial non exclusionary account of Black political solidarity that would welcome everyone who supports reparative justice for Black American blacks as descendants of American slavery
