

Trilogy Clinical Manual Addendum

This addendum updates information in Trilogy100, Trilogy200, Trilogy202, and Trilogy O2 (all manuals).

Mouthplece Ventilation (MPV)

MPV is a new feature in AC and PC modes for patients who are not invasively ventilated. The therapy, triogering, alarms, and user interface will provide on-demand ventilation without the need for an exhalation device. In addition, the Philips Respironics MPV Disposable Circuit further simplifies the user experience and ensures proper operation.

A new feature within MPV is the Circuit Disconnect IMPV) alarm. This alarm will notify the patient or caregiver that a spontaneous breath has not been initiated within the selected period. This may be useful to alert a caregiver when a patient is unable to connect to the mouthpiece or if the patient has fallen asleep.

Setting up the MPV feature

Breathing Circuit Types

The available Philips Respironics MPV Disposable Circuit (or an equivalent circuit) is required for the proper operation of MPV. This circuit is supplied without an exhalation device and is not intended to support exhaling into the circuit.

For those patients who prefer to exhale into the breathing circuit, the passive and active circuits currently offered with the Trilogy ventilator may be used with MPV. Refer to chapter 4 of the manual (see section titled "Connect the Breathing Circuit to the Ventilator).

Connect the MPV Breathing Circuit to the Ventilator

When using the available Philips Respironics MPV Disposable Circuit, always follow the instructions included with the circuit.


Set up the Ventilator to Use MPV

- Go to the Set-up screen when therapy is OFF, MPV cannot be enabled when the therapy is being delivered.
- Select the Circuit Type: If you have a prescription that uses an active circuit, set the Circuit Type to match the prescription you normally use. Otherwise, set the Circuit Type to Passive.
- Set the Mode to AC or PC, MPV is only available in these two modes.
- Set MPV to ONL
