

Some problems in treating borderline patients

“... ruleless fantasy approaches madness, where fantasy plays completely with the human being and the unfortunate victim has not control at all over the course of his representations”

(Kant, 2006[1798], p. 75)

There are many reasons why the treatment of borderline patients is difficult. I will explore two of them in this chapter. First, these patients are unable to understand their own psychic functioning and the reasons for others' behaviours due to their lack of an emotional-receptive capacity. Second, since they come from a traumatic environment, they are particularly susceptible to frustrations and react violently to conflict, attempting vindictive revenge against the objects they clash with. This is why borderline patients often perpetuate a very tenacious bond with their traumatising primary objects, from which they cannot separate.

As is known, the term “borderline” was first used to define a psychopathological syndrome halfway between neurosis and psychosis, characterised by a group of symptoms that belonged to both nosographic categories but which implied potential psychotic development concealed behind a neurotic façade.

these characteristics for several months to a period of several years. In addition, most mental health experts avoid making a diagnosis throughout childhood and adolescence because the mind of a child or an adolescent works differently than the mind of an adult. It is the general consensus that it is important to wait until a person has reached adulthood, thereby allowing the brain to fully develop before a diagnosis can be made with any certainty whatsoever. This is done so that mental health professionals can work on the side of caution. However, it sometimes has rather detrimental effects for the person that is suffering from the disorder because anyone that has been displaying these characteristics earlier in their life is often forced to either go without treatment or be treated for something that they are not suffering from until they finally get a definitive diagnosis. This makes it that much more difficult for anyone that is finally diagnosed to get the proper treatment and for the treatment to be effective.
