1. How did American wealth enrich Spain? In what ways did they try to change Native cultures? Who is Pope and why did he rebel?

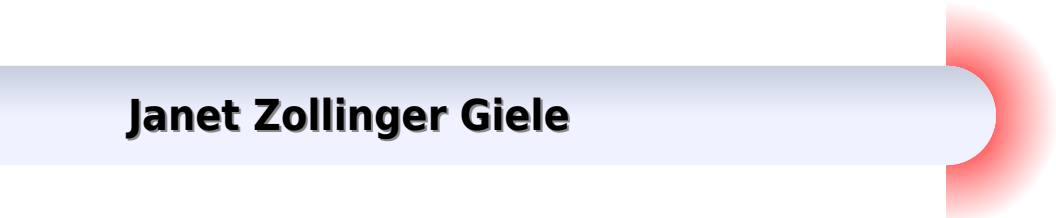
English colonization in the Chesapeake
