**Mariana Griswold Van Rensselaer** Judith K. Major, 2013-04-23 Mariana Griswold Van Rensselaer 1851 1934 was one of the premier figures in landscape writing and design at the turn of the twentieth century a moment when the amateur pursuit of gardening and the increasingly professionalized landscape design field were beginning to diverge This intellectual
