forced audiences to read between half lines to hear what was not said By decluttering and stripping away excess by drawing words through a tight mesh of meter alliteration and rhyme the early northern poet filtered out dross and stitched together a poetics of stark contrasts and forebodings Poets and lovers of poetry of all periods and places will find much to enjoy here So will students in Old English and Old Norse courses
