by recognizing that the actors utilities and preferences are socially constructed from the identities the actors take on in the choice situation The book develops a formal model that links the interpretation of unobserved utilities to preferences for the public goods outcome It then applies the model to case studies on global monetary management collective security and protecting human rights Bringing constructivism into the public goods decision allows the analysis to look beyond the limited Prisoner s Dilemma based model of most rational choice approaches and recognizes that the decision whether or not to produce a global public good is a complex web of social political and cultural factors
