

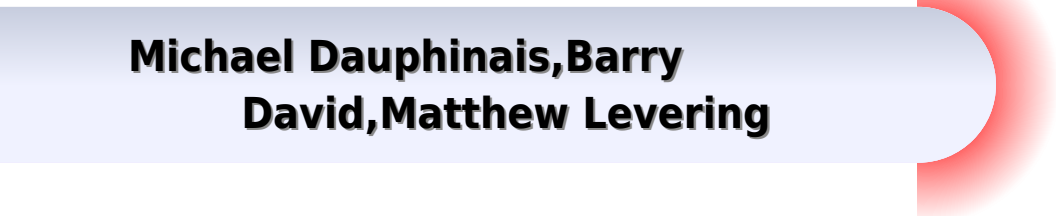

Aquinas Michael Dauphinais, Matthew Levering, 2005 Written by leading experts on Aquinas s theology the essays in Reading John with St Thomas Aquinas bear common witness to a central theological conviction the tasks of biblical exegesis and speculative theology though distinct indwell and inform each other As the first book length study of the full breadth of Aquinas s Commentary on the Gospel of John this work illuminates the way in which thinking systematically or speculatively about revelation flows from questions raised within biblical exegesis itself Like any medieval biblical commentator Aquinas attempts to understand a biblical text not only in itself but also by appealing to parallel interpretive texts drawn from throughout the Bible as well as the accumulated insights of the Church Fathers This method enables him to penetrate deeply into the thought of the Bible recognizing that the biblical authors speaking from within the context of Israel and the Church raise questions that are theological and that belong to coherent speculative theological frameworks The result is in large part a speculative theological commentary that is not imposed on the biblical texts but emerges from it necessary conjunction of the inspired words of Scripture exegetical commentary and theological analysis The volume is both a study of Aquinas s thought and an attempt to foster contemporary exegetical approaches that emphasize the need to interpret Scripture speculatively through the historical lens of tradition Prophetic Liturgy Tércio Junker, 2014-02-07 The primary purpose of Prophetic Liturgy is to inquire into the prophetic dimension of the liturgy Some questions addressed in the book are How can a liturgy be prophetic How can liturgy form and transform individuals and communities In which sense does the liturgy facilitate a living participation in socio political economic life How does the sacramental practice challenge the church to mediate God s gifts of grace love justice and mercy to the world Possible answers for these questions begin to emerge as we develop an understanding of religious praxis as an active and dynamic prophetic action in which the community of faith claims its identity promotes an engaged faithful Christian life and affirms the sacramental life of the church as a source of formation and inspiration for prophetic praxis mediating God s gift for the life of the world There is risk in presenting an

option for prophetic praxis in that it may go beyond the comfort zone of a community and engender spiritual and political alienation. The most challenging ethical hope of this book is to provide the worshipping community with prophetic awareness of socio-economic injustice while at the same time preserving the community's historical-cultural identity, its religious values and its sacramental spirituality.

Reading Old Testament Narrative as Christian Scripture Douglas S. Earl, 2017-03-03
Douglas Earl sets out a fresh perspective on understanding what is involved in reading Old Testament narrative as Christian Scripture. Earl considers various narratives as examples that model different interpretive challenges in the form of exegetical, ethical, historical, metaphysical, and theological difficulties. Using these examples, the significance of interpretive approaches focused on authorial intention, history of composition, canonical context, reception history, and reading context are considered in conjunction with spiritual, literary, structuralist, existential, historical, critical, and ethical critical approaches. Christian interpretation of Scripture as Scripture is shown to be an inherently ad hoc task understood as a rule-governed practice in Wittgenstein's sense: an established goal-directed activity for which no method, hermeneutical principle, or critical perspective discovers meaning or generates good interpretation. Good interpretation involves exploration of various construals of the world of the text using hermeneutics of tradition and critique of ideology. Ricoeur: The interpreter's task is to discern faithful readings and develop their significance in a given intellectual or cultural context. The interpretation of Scripture and its appropriation is seen to involve wisdom in forming judgments on a case-by-case basis learned through examples and experience on what constitutes good interpretation and use. Earl shows how traditional hermeneutics and contemporary critical resources suggest that history, ethics, and theology can rarely be read off Old Testament narrative but also how Christians can appropriate ethically and historically problematic books such as Joshua faithfully adopt a minimalist approach to 1-2 Samuel and embrace a Trinitarian reading of Genesis 1.

Freedom and Flourishing Robert Leigh, 2017-11-09
Freedom is vital both to Karl Barth's theology and to modern religion, politics, and culture. Leigh describes how Barth's lifelong fascination by freedom culminated in a fresh, daring engagement with it in his last completed book, volume IV/3 of the massive *Church Dogmatics*, which is probably the most important work of Christian theology in the twentieth century. That volume builds on Barth's earlier work but also goes beyond it in ways that have not yet been appreciated. Leigh shows how this mature theology of Barth not only responds profoundly to key questions about freedom both in philosophy and theology but also opens up a rich, habitable understanding of Jesus Christ and of life in relationship with him that is prophetic for the twenty-first century. This involves a dynamic integration of knowing with being, being with action, truth with witness, individual with community, and divine initiative with human flourishing. At the heart of this life with God is participation in the asymmetrical yet utterly reciprocal interaction between human beings and the God who loves them in freedom. Leigh succeeds both in describing this participation convincingly and in demonstrating its provocative attractiveness.

Appasamy and his Reading of Rāmānuja Brian Philip Dunn, 2016-12-01 In this work Brian Philip Dunn focuses on the embodiment theology of the South Indian theologian A J Appasamy 1891-1975 Appasamy developed what he called a bhakti devotional approach to Christian theology bringing his own primary text the Gospel of John into comparative interaction with the writings of the Hindu philosopher and theologian Rāmānuja Dunn's exposition here is of Appasamy's distinctive adaptation of Rāmānuja's Body of God analogy and its application to a bhakti reading of John's Gospel He argues throughout for the need to locate and understand theological language as embedded and embodied within the narrative and praxis of tradition and for Appasamy and Rāmānuja in their respective Anglican and revival settings Responding to Appasamy Dunn proposes that the primary Johannine referent for divine embodiment is the temple and considers recent scholarship on Johannine temple Christology in light of revival conceptions of the temple and the temple deity He then offers a constructive reading of the text as a temple procession a heuristic device that can be newly considered in both comparative and devotional contexts today

Free Churches and the Body of Christ Jeffrey W. Cary, 2012-11-05 Those within the free church tradition have often appealed to the notion of the invisible church to account for the unity of the Body of Christ A growing number of free church theologians however are giving increased attention to the importance of visible ecclesial unity which immediately raises the perennial problem of the authorities by which unity is maintained There is also a growing recognition among free church theologians of the need to recognize the authority of tradition in tandem with the authority of Scripture In this book Cary affirms these recent developments but then inquires whether a turn toward visible unity together with an embrace of the authority of tradition can eventually be coherent without also embracing the authority of an extra congregational teaching office To guide his study Cary engages the work of two theologians from outside the free church tradition Robert Jenson and Rowan Williams He then brings them into contact with the prominent free church theologian James McClendon in order to supplement some of the deficiencies Cary perceives in McClendon's groundbreaking work Once these deficiencies are addressed however the question intensifies whether the free church tradition as such can remain a coherent ecclesial option over time

God, Evil and the Limits of Theology Karen Kilby, 2020-09-03 Karen Kilby explores the doctrine of the Trinity and issues of evil suffering and sin She offers a critique of the lack of respect for mystery found in the most popular Trinitarian thinking of our time Kilby gives an apophatic reading of Aquinas on the Trinity and offers a distinct next step in the sequence on the Trinity the appeal of social doctrines of the Trinity lies principally in their ecclesial and political relevance She engages with Miroslav Volf's famous The Trinity is our social program essay and addresses the question of what an alternative politics of an apophatic theology of the Trinity might look like The essays explore the question of theodicy and argue that evil poses a question to Christians and Christian's theology which can neither be answered nor dismissed Kilby argues that Christians must live with this mystery

this lack of resolution rather than trying to diminish the gravity of evil or allowing evil to dictate their conception of God's goodness or power. By offering a critical reading of Hans Urs von Balthasar and Julian of Norwich she explores the question of whether Christianity can avoid giving a positive valuation to suffering and concludes the two represent two different strands within the Christian tradition in relation to thought on suffering.

Reading Sacred Scripture Stephen Westerholm, Martin Westerholm, 2016. A rich display of the Christian tradition's reading of Scripture. Though well known and oft repeated the advice to read the Bible like any other book fails to acknowledge that different books call for different kinds of reading. The voice of Scripture summons readers to hear and respond to its words as divine address. Not everyone chooses to read the Bible on those terms but in *Reading Sacred Scripture* Stephen and Martin Westerholm father and son invite their readers to engage seriously with a dozen major Bible interpreters ranging from the second century to the twentieth who have been attentive to Scripture's voice. After expertly setting forth pertinent background context in two initial chapters the Westerholms devote a separate chapter to each interpreter exploring how these key Christian thinkers each understood Scripture and how it should be read.
