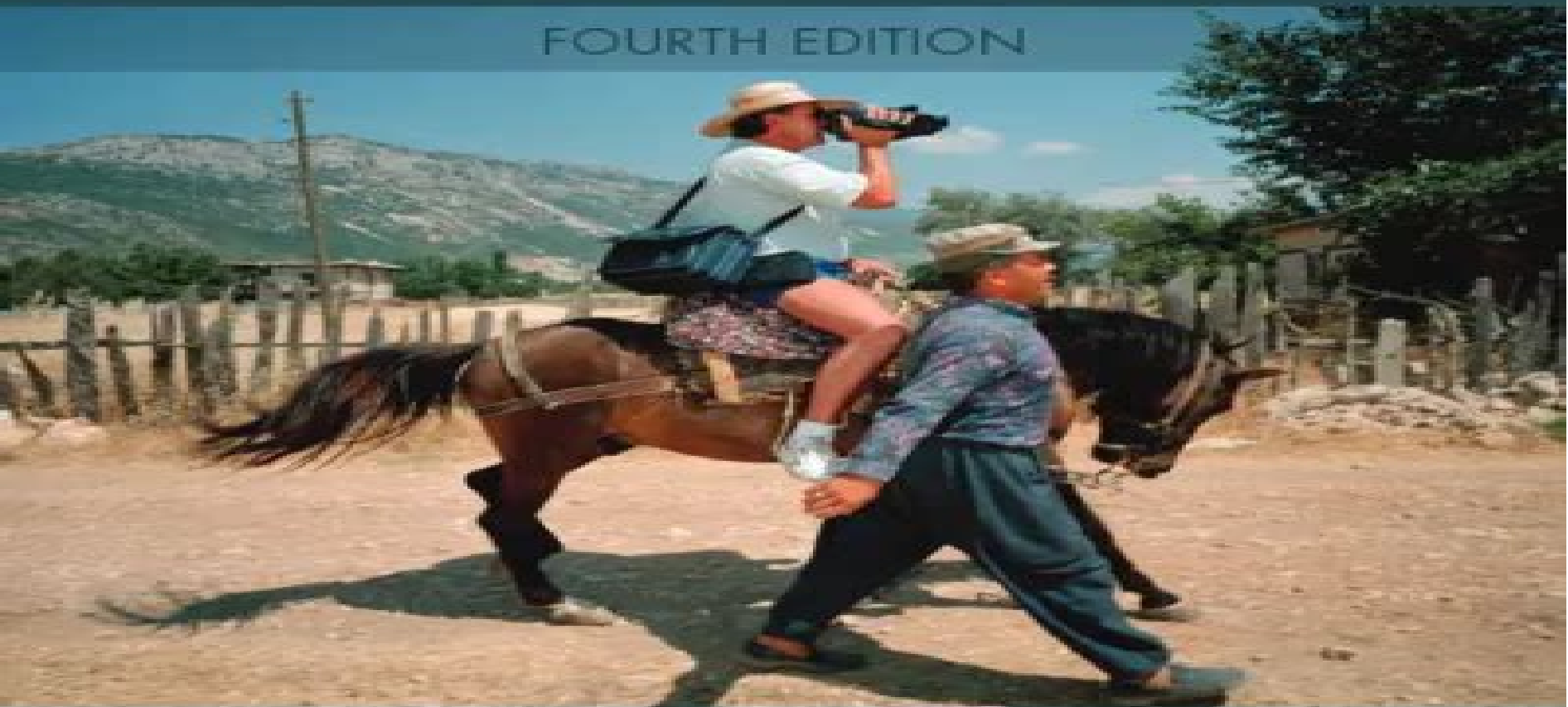

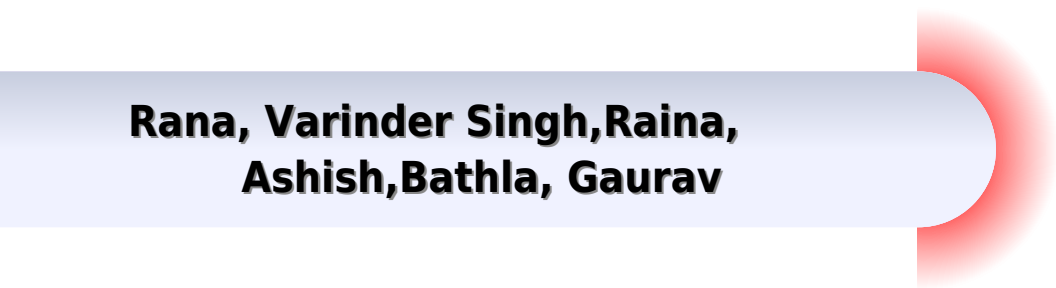

Are ever expanding tourism markets and the new responsible forms of tourism in particular a smoke-free socio-culturally sensitive form of human industrialisation? Tourism and Sustainability critically explores and challenges what have emerged as the most significant universal geopolitical norms of the last half century: development, globalization and sustainability. And through the lens of new forms of tourism, it demonstrates how we can better understand and get to grips with the rapidly changing new global order. This third edition has been extensively updated and includes new material on poverty reduction, livelihoods and pro-poor tourism, new forms of tourism in cities, continuing growth of the fair trade movement, tourism's contribution to climate change, volunteer and gap tourism, affect of disasters on new tourism. Drawing on a range of examples from across the Third World, Tourism and Sustainability illustrates the social, economic and environmental conditions for the growth of new tourism.
