Baddeley and Graham Hitch's Working Memory Birgit Koopmann-Holm, Alexander O'Connor, 2017-07-05 The work of memory researchers Alan Baddeley and Graham Hitch is a prime example of the ways in which good critical thinkers approach questions and the problems they raise In the 1960s researchers into human memory began to understand memory as comprising not one but two systems The first was a short term system handling information for mere seconds.
