Peoples of a Sonoran Desert Oasis Jared Orsi, 2023-10-17 In the southwestern corner of Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument on the border between Arizona and Mexico one finds Quitobaquito the second largest oasis in the Sonoran Desert There with some effort one might also find remnants of once thriving O odham communities and their predecessors with roots reaching back at least 12 000 years along with evidence of their expulsion the erasure of their past attempts to recover that history and the role of the National Park Service NPS at every layer The outlines of the lost landscapes of Quitobaquito now further threatened by the looming border wall reemerge in Peoples of a Sonoran Desert Oasis as Jared Orsi tells the story of the land its inhabitants ancient and recent and the efforts of the NPS to reclaim Quitobaquito s pristine natural form and to reverse the damage done to the O odham community and culture first by colonial incursions and then by proponents of preservation Quitobaquito is ecologically and culturally rich and this book summons both the natural and human history of this unique place to describe how people have made use of the land for some five hundred generations subject to the shifting forces of subsistence and commerce tradition and progress cultural and biological preservation Throughout Orsi details the processes by which the NPS obliterated those cultural landscapes and then subsequently as America began to reckon with its colonial legacy worked with O odham peoples to restore their rightful heritage Tracing the building and erasing of past landscapes to make some of them more visible in the present Peoples of a Sonoran Desert Oasis reveals how colonial legacies became embedded in national parks and points to the possibility that such legacies might be undone and those lost landscapes remade

The Divide Between Humanities and Science Richard Brusca, 2025-03-28 The humanities have become increasingly siloed and distant from science. This book will address the reasons for this and the harm it is doing and it illustrates ways to bring these endeavours back together that are beneficial to both disciplines. Humanities are the cultural undertakings: art, music, literature, theater, philosophy, etc. that set us apart from the rest of the animal kingdom. Humanities teach us to think creatively, reason, and analyse complex situations. They offer practical skills crucial in professional settings like critical thinking, empathy, cross-cultural acceptance, reading and writing skills, and clear communication. The humanities steer us away from xenophobia and toward understanding and empathy. They broaden our mind in ways that are healthy for individuals and society. Recently, colleges of arts and science have been diminished. In the US, fewer than 80 such programs remain in higher education out of 4,000 US universities/colleges with severe cuts of faculty and programs in the humanities. The proportion of undergraduate students studying humanities fell 30% between 2005 and 2020. Elected officials are advocating for elimination of state funding for the humanities. The great divide between humanities and science continues to grow. K-12 STEM and Common Core Standards discourage reading literature and students arrive at college unprepared, lacking endurance to read long passages or write a proper paragraph. Some question the point of reading at all. Today, few scholars work comfortably across science and humanities. This volume will express the views of some individuals who do so, producing creative works that express the nature of how a blending of these great human pursuits can be accomplished.

Sanctuary Everywhere Barbara Andrea Sostaita, 2024-08-23 In *Sanctuary Everywhere* Barbara Andrea Sostaita reimagines practices of sanctuary along the U S Mexico border in order to explore the possibilities for radical fugitivity in the face of militarized border enforcement After the 2016 presidential election churches universities cities and even states began declaring themselves sanctuaries Sostaita proposes that these calls for expanded sanctuary are insufficient when dealing with the everyday workings of immigration enforcement Through fieldwork in migrant clinics shelters and the Sonoran Desert Sostaita demonstrates that as a sacred practice sanctuary cannot be fixed in any one destination or mandate She turns to those working to create sanctuary on the move from a deported nurse offering medical care on the border to incarcerated migrant women denying rules on touch in detention facilities to collectives set up to honor those who died crossing the border Understanding sanctuary to be a set of fugitive practices that escapes the everyday Sostaita shows us how in the wake of extreme violence and loss migrants create sanctuaries of their own to care for the living and the dead

suffocate Traci Brynne Voyles's history of the Salton Sea examines how settler colonialism restructures physical environments in ways that further Indigenous dispossession racial capitalism and degradation of the natural world In other words The Settler Sea asks how settler colonialism entraps nature to do settlers work for them The Salton Sea Southern California's largest inland body of water occupies the space between the lush agricultural farmland of the Imperial Valley and the austere desert called America's Sahara The sea sits near the boundary between the United States and Mexico and lies at the often contested intersections of the sovereign lands of the Torres Martinez Desert Cahuilla and the state of California Created in 1905 when overflow from the Colorado River combined with a poorly constructed irrigation system to cause the whole river to flow into the desert this human maintained body of water has been considered a looming environmental disaster The Salton Sea's very precariousness the way it sits uncomfortably between worlds existing always in the interstices of human and natural influences between desert and wetland between the skyward pull of the sun and the constant inflow of polluted water is both a symptom and symbol of the larger precariousness of settler relationships to the environment in the West and beyond Voyles provides an innovative exploration of the Salton Sea looking to the ways the sea its origins and its role in human life have been vital to the people who call this region home **Maxwell Street** Tim Cresswell, 2019-03-22
