World Development Report 2012 World Bank, 2011-09-01 This year's World Development Report looks at facts and trends regarding the various dimensions of gender equality in the context of the development process *World Development Report 2012* The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development / The World Bank The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development / The World Bank, 2011-09-28 The lives of women around the world have improved dramatically at a pace and scope difficult to imagine even 25 years ago Women have made unprecedented gains in rights education health and access to jobs and livelihoods More countries than ever guarantee equal rights in property marriage and other domains Gender gaps in primary schooling have closed in many countries while in a third of all countries girls now outnumber boys in secondary school And more young women than men attend universities in 60 countries Women are using their education to participate more in the labor force they now make up for 40 percent of the global labor force and 43 percent of its farmers Moreover women now live longer than men in every region of the world Despite the progress gaps remain in many areas Women are more likely to die relative to males in many low and middle income countries than their counterparts in rich countries especially in childhood and during their reproductive years Primary and secondary school enrollments for girls remain much lower than for boys in many Sub Saharan African countries and some parts of South Asia as well as among disadvantaged populations Women are more likely than men to work as unpaid family laborers or in the informal sector to farm smaller plots and grow less profitable crops operate in smaller firms and less profitable sectors and generally earn less Women especially poor women have less say over decisions and less control over household resources And in most countries fewer women participate in formal politics than men and are underrepresented in the upper echelons The World Development Report 2012 Gender Equality and Development argues that closing these persistent gender gaps matters It matters because gender equality is a core development objective in its own right But it is also smart economics Greater gender equality can enhance productivity improve development outcomes for the next generation and make institutions more representative Building on a growing body of knowledge on the economics of gender equality and development the Report identifies the areas where gender gaps are most significant both intrinsically and in terms of their potential development payoff and where growth alone cannot solve the issues It then sets forth four priorities for public action Reducing excess female mortality and closing education gaps where they remain Improving access to economic opportunities for women Increasing women's voice and agency in the household and in society Limiting the reproduction of gender inequality across generations [World Development Report 2012](#) World Bank, 2011-09-22 The WDR 2012 Gender Equality and Development will focus on the evolution of gender equality across the world in the context of the development process The report will consider gender equality as a core development goal in itself and will argue that gender equality matters for the pace of development Improvements in gender equality can generate gains in economic efficiency and

improvements in other development outcomes And gender equality has consequences for the quality and representativeness of the institutions a society develops For key dimensions of gender equality the report will show that although many women around the world still continue to struggle with gender based disadvantages much has changed for the better and at a more rapid pace than ever before But the report will also show that progress needs to be expanded protected and deepened In order to understand why progress has varied across dimensions of gender equality and between countries the report will look at how markets interact with formal and informal institutions to influence household decision making by providing incentives shaping preferences or imposing constraints Markets and institutions can combine to provide strong incentives for greater gender equality but can also fail to do so if they treat males and females differentially Policymakers and practitioners still face gaps in knowledge both in how gender equality matters for development and how best to incorporate these links in policy design This WDR aims to bridge these gaps by building upon the growing body of multidisciplinary theory evidence and data on these links while highlighting the knowledge gaps that remain

World development report 2012 World Bank,2011 World Development Report 2013 World Bank,2012-10-15 Jobs provide higher earnings and better benefits as countries grow but they are also a driver of development Poverty falls as people work their way out of hardship and as jobs empowering women lead to greater investments in children Efficiency increases as workers get better at what they do as more productive jobs appear and less productive ones disappear Societies flourish as jobs bring together people from different ethnic and social backgrounds and provide alternatives to conflict Jobs are thus more than a byproduct of economic growth They are transformational they are what we earn what we do and even who we are High unemployment and unmet job expectations among youth are the most immediate concerns But in many developing countries where farming and self employment are prevalent and safety nets are modest are best unemployment rates can be low In these countries growth is seldom jobless Most of their poor work long hours but simply cannot make ends meet And the violation of basic rights is not uncommon Therefore the number of jobs is not all that matters jobs with high development payoffs are needed Confronted with these challenges policy makers ask difficult questions Should countries build their development strategies around growth or should they focus on jobs Can entrepreneurship be fostered especially among the many microenterprises in developing countries or are entrepreneurs born Are greater investments in education and training a prerequisite for employability or can skills be built through jobs In times of major crises and structural shifts should jobs not just workers be protected And is there a risk that policies supporting job creation in one country will come at the expense of jobs in other countries The World Development Report 2013 Jobs offers answers to these and other difficult questions by looking at jobs as drivers of development not as derived labor demand and by considering all types of jobs not just formal wage employment The Report provides a framework that cuts across sectors and shows that the best policy responses vary across countries depending on their levels of development endowments demography and institutions Policy fundamentals matter in all cases

that these have on people's lives and identities. Finally, the text considers the possibilities and limitations of different development strategies. The main arguments of the book are richly illustrated through case study material drawn from across the Global South as well as full colour figures and photos. Enterprising Women, Mary Hallward-Driemeier, 2013-06-10. This book brings together new household and enterprise data from 41 countries in Sub-Saharan Africa to inform policy makers and practitioners on ways to expand women entrepreneurs' economic opportunities. Sub-Saharan Africa boasts the highest share of women entrepreneurs, but they are disproportionately concentrated among the self-employed rather than employers. Relative to men, women are pursuing lower opportunity activities; with their enterprises more likely to be smaller, informal, and in low value added lines of business. The challenge in expanding opportunities is not helping more women become entrepreneurs, but enabling them to shift to higher return activities. A central question addressed in the book is what explains the gender sorting in the types of enterprises that women and men run. The analysis shows that many Sub-Saharan countries present a challenging environment for women. Four key areas of the agenda for expanding women's economic opportunities in Africa are analyzed: strengthening women's property

rights and their ability to control assets improving women s access to finance building human capital in business skills and networks and strengthening women s voices in business environment reform These areas are important both because they have wide gender gaps and because they help explain gender differences in entrepreneurial activities It is particularly striking that while gender gaps in education tend to close with higher incomes gaps in women s property rights and in women s participation in reform processes do not As simply raising a country s income is unlikely to be sufficient to give women equal ability to control assets or have greater voice more proactive steps will be needed Practical guidelines to move the agenda forward are discussed for each of these key areas
