Wasp Women Airforce Service Pilots:

Clipped Wings Molly Merryman, 2020-09-15 Revives the overlooked stories of pioneering women aviators who are also featured in the forthcoming documentary film *Coming Home Fight for a Legacy During World War II* all branches of the military had women's auxiliaries Only the Women Airforce Service Pilots WASP program however was made up entirely of women who undertook dangerous missions more commonly associated with and desired by men Within military hierarchies the World War II pilot was perceived as the most dashing and desirable of servicemen Flyboys were the daring elite of the United States military More than the WACs Army WAVES Navy SPARS Coast Guard or Women Marines the WASPs directly challenged these assumptions of male supremacy in wartime culture WASPs flew the fastest fighter planes and heaviest bombers they test piloted experimental models and worked in the development of weapons systems Yet the WASPs were the only women's auxiliary within the armed services of World War II that was not militarized In *Clipped Wings* Molly Merryman draws upon military documents many of which weren't declassified until the 1990s congressional records and interviews with the women who served as WASPs during World War II to trace the history of the over one thousand pilots who served their country as the first women to fly military planes She examines the social pressures that culminated in their disbandment in 1944 even though a wartime need for their services still existed and documents their struggles and eventual success in 1977 to gain military status and receive veterans benefits In the preface to this reissued edition Merryman reflects on the changes in women's aviation in the past twenty years as NASA's new Artemis program promises to land the first female astronaut on the moon and African American and lesbian women are among the newest pilot recruits Updating the story of the WASPs Merryman reveals that even in the past few years there have been more battles for them to fight and more national recognition for them to receive At its heart the story of the Women Airforce Service Pilots is not about war or planes it is a story about persistence and extraordinary achievement These accomplished women pilots did more than break the barriers of flight they established a model for equality

A Wasp Among Eagles Ann Carl, 2013-06-04 Before World War II most Americans did not believe that the average woman could fly professionally but during the war more than a thousand women pilots proved them wrong These were the Women Airforce Service Pilots WASPs who served as military flyers on the home front In March 1944 one of them Ann Baumgartner was assigned to the Fighter Flight Test Branch at Wright Field in Dayton Ohio There she would make history as the only woman to test fly experimental planes during the war and the first woman to fly a jet A WASP among Eagles is the first person story of how Baumgartner learned to fly trained as a WASP and became one of the earliest jet age pioneers Flying such planes as the Curtiss A 25 Helldiver the Lockheed P 38 and the B 29 Superfortress she was the first woman to participate in a host of experiments including in air

The Women with Silver Wings Katherine Sharp Landdeck,2020 The thrilling true story of the daring female aviators who helped the United States win World War II only to be forgotten by the country they served When Japanese planes executed a sneak attack on Pearl Harbor in December 1941 Cornelia Fort was already in the air At twenty two Cornelia had escaped Nashville s debutante scene for a fresh start as a flight instructor in Hawaii She and her student were in the middle of their lesson when the bombs began to fall and they barely made it back to ground that morning Still when the U S Army Air Forces put out a call for women pilots to aid the war effort Cornelia was one of the first to respond She became one of just over 1 100 women from across the nation to make it through the Army s rigorous selection process and earn her silver wings In *The Women with Silver Wings* historian Katherine Sharp Landdeck introduces us to these young women as they meet even tempered methodical Nancy Love and demanding visionary Jacqueline Cochran the trailblazing pilots who first envisioned sending American women into the air and whose rivalry would define the Women Airforce Service Pilots For women like Cornelia it was a chance to serve their country and to prove that women aviators were just as skilled and able as men While not authorized to serve in combat the WASP helped train male pilots for service abroad and ferried bombers and pursuits across the country Thirty eight of them would not survive the war But even taking into account these tragic losses Love and Cochran s social experiment seemed to be a resounding success until with the tides of war turning and fewer male pilots needed in Europe Congress clipped the women s wings The program was disbanded the women sent home But the bonds they d forged never failed and over the next few decades they came together to fight for recognition as the military veterans they were and for their place in history *Letters Home 1944-1945* Bernice Falk Haydu,2008 [The WASP](#) J. American women pilots garnered much attention during the Gulf War but American women were in fact military pilots as far back as World War II. Anne Noggle, now a photographer and author based in Albuquerque, has captured the spirit of these dynamic aviation pioneers in her photographic book *For God, Country, and the Thrill of It*. In 1943-44, Noggle was a WASP, a member of the Women Airforce Service Pilots group, the country's first women military pilots. She and her colleagues disproved assertions that women would be too emotional or high strung to fly military aircraft. They flew every type of plane in use at the time, initially ferrying aircraft wherever they were needed and later serving as test pilots and enemy in training maneuvers for male combat flyers. Earning 50¢ a month less than male counterparts in noncombatant roles, WASPs were called on several times to test planes such as the P-39 that male flyers had declared flying coffins. The women flyers had better records and adhered to flight regulations and after their test flights the military declared that the planes were indeed safe to fly if flown properly. Still, thirty-eight WASPs did lose their lives on active duty. Not until 1979, however, did Congress affirm that these women had been in active military service and were thus eligible for veterans' benefits. Women Airforce Service Pilots had been abruptly dismissed in December 1944 when it was decided that they were no longer needed. Since 1944, Anne Noggle has been a flight instructor, a crop duster and an air show pilot. More recently, she has turned her considerable energy and enthusiasm toward photography and serves on the arts faculty at the University of New Mexico. It was at the 1986 WASP reunion at their old training ground on the flat prairies of Sweetwater, Texas, that Anne Noggle made the stunning photographs of these military pioneers. The Chicago Tribune reported that the portraits, taken against a neutral background that focuses attention on the women themselves, are the heart of the book. Pride and confidence are hallmarks of these pictures. Some women wear their

uniforms and the rest wear every manner of civilian dress But all of them wear their wings and their age with the distinct bearing of people who challenged their own strength of character and won The WASP portraits have been exhibited across the country Ms Noggle's interest in photography on women's experiences in the military took her to Moscow three times even as the Soviet Union dissolved Her forthcoming book *A Dance with Death* fall 1994 presents the stories of the Soviet Union's female combat pilots in World War II along with historic photographs and contemporary portraits by Noggle

On Shifting Ground, 2018 This interdisciplinary thesis explores the Women Airforce Service Pilots WASP of World War II from a social constructionist epistemology and the theoretical framework of a feminist historian It examines the public images Mrs Jacqueline Cochran Odlum Director of Women Pilots U S Army Air Forces and Nancy Harkness Love Director of Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron created and portrayed in the media in contrast to the private lived experiences of individual WASP veterans This thesis adds to existing literature by providing new insights into the WASP's experiences within the cultural and gender norms of the WWII era The arguments presented in this study are supported by analysis of primary source documents including media reports videos and motion picture films military accessions policies recruiting correspondence official military reports attrition rates Congressional testimony personal correspondence and WASP autobiographies In addition five oral history interviews were conducted with WASP veterans living in California Colorado and Pennsylvania provided first person testimony to support the researcher's findings regarding the WASPs complicity in or resistance to several forms of oppression prevalent during the WWII era sexism racism classism and heteronormativity By examining the WASPs wartime military service additional insights were gained into their gender non conformity based on their decisions to pursue careers as pilots in a field heretofore deemed masculine or men's work

"Lipstick Squadron" Sarah Elizabeth Myers, 2009 During World War II the United States Air Force submitted women pilots for the first time into a program called the Women Airforce Service Pilots WASP These women pilots faced gendered discrimination and reactions from Air Force men and American society Many assumed women were physically emotionally and intellectually inferior to male pilots The WASP program concluded in 1944 and women were not admitted into the Air Force again until the late 1970s This study focuses on an analysis of the media's coverage of these women pilots during the war The War Department Bureau of Public Relations Air Force officials and WASP Director Jacqueline Cochran worked to control the media's access to the

WASP program As a result of public fears surrounding military women Cochran assigned specific rules and guidelines to protect the pure feminine image of the WASP Overall media outlets portrayed the WASP as glamorized feminine aviators Issues largely ignored by the media including the dangerous roles assigned the WASP flying demonstrations to prove the safety of certain aircraft to men and the women s outstanding physical mental and emotional record illuminate the gendered relations of the period
