Richmond, 2016-08-11 In 1768 the sixty year struggle to open the lands of the Kayaderosseras Patent north of Albany for settlement was finally resolved The long conflict with France was over and disputes over ownership rights with the local Mohawk Indians had been settled This is the story of the families that left their homesteads in Connecticut and moved to Middleline Road in Ball's Town in the Patent There they began their new life on the frontier soon to be interrupted by the American Revolution As Yankees most of these pioneers supported the rebel cause In 1780 the war came to them as a contingent of 200 British soldiers Loyalists and Mohawk Indians descended on Ball's Town pillaging and burning their newly built cabins In the wake of the raid twenty five men were carried off to Canada where many remained imprisoned until the end of the War two years later War on the Middleline is the story of these families their heritage and the hardships they endured during the founding of our nation The Nation's First Monument and the Origins of the American Memorial Tradition Sally Webster, 2017-07-05 The commemorative tradition in early American art is given sustained consideration for the first time in Sally Webster's study of public monuments and the construction of an American patronymic tradition Until now no attempt has been made to create a coherent early history of the carved symbolic language of American liberty and independence Establishing as the basis of her discussion the fledgling nation s first monument Jean Jacques Caffi s Monument to General Richard Montgomery commissioned in January of 1776 Webster builds on the themes of commemoration and national patrimony ultimately positing that like its instruments of government America drew from the Enlightenment and its reverence for the classical past Webster's study is grounded in the political and social worlds of New York City moving chronologically from the 1760s to the 1790s with a concluding chapter considering the monument which lies just east of Ground Zero against the backdrop of 9 11 It is an original contribution to historical scholarship in fields ranging from early American art sculpture New York history and the Revolutionary era A chapter is devoted to the exceptional role of Benjamin Franklin in the commissioning and design of the monument Webster's study provides a new focus on New York City as the 18th century city in which the European tradition of public commemoration was reconstituted **Speculators in Empire** William J Campbell, 2015-04-29 At the 1768 Treaty of Fort as monuments to liberty s heroes Stanwix the British secured the largest land cession in colonial North America Crown representatives gained possession of an area claimed but not occupied by the Iroquois that encompassed parts of New York Pennsylvania Ohio Kentucky and West Virginia The Iroquois however were far from na ve and the outcome was not an instance of their simply being dispossessed by Europeans In Speculators in Empire William J Campbell examines the diplomacy land speculation and empire building that led up to the treaty His detailed study overturns common assumptions about the roles of the Iroquois and British on the eve of the American Revolution Through the treaty the Iroquois directed the expansion of empire in order to serve their own needs while Crown negotiators obtained more territory than they were authorized to accept How did this questionable transfer happen who benefited and at what cost Campbell unravels complex intercultural negotiations in which colonial officials land speculators traders tribes and individual Indians pursued a variety of agendas each side possessing considerable understanding of the other s expectations and intentions Historians have credited British Indian superintendent Sir William Johnson with pulling off the land grab but Campbell shows that Johnson was only one of many players Johnson s deputy George Croghan used the treaty to capitalize on a lifetime of scheming and speculation Iroquois leaders and their peoples also benefited substantially With keen awareness of the workings of the English legal system they gained protection for their homelands by opening the Ohio country to settlement Campbell's navigation of the complexities of Native and British politics and land speculation illuminates a time when regional concerns and personal politicking would have lasting consequences for the continent As Speculators in Empire shows colonial and Native history are unavoidably entwined and Law and Politics in British Colonial Thought S.
