Writing Signs Irene A. Bierman, 1998-12-16 Irene Bierman explores the complex relationship between alphabet and language as well as the ways the two elements are socially defined by time and place. She focuses her exploration on the Eastern Mediterranean in the sixth through twelfth centuries, notably Cairo's Fatimid dynasty of 969-1171. Examining the inscriptions on Fatimid architecture and textiles, Bierman offers insight into all elements of that society, from religion to the economy and the enormous changes the dynasty underwent during that period. Bierman addresses fundamental issues of what buildings mean, how inscriptions affect that meaning, and the role of written messages and the ceremonies into which they are incorporated in service of propagandist goals. Her method and conclusions provide a pioneering model for studying public writing in other societies and offer powerful evidence to show that writing is a highly charged and deeply embedded social practice.

Viewing Inscriptions in the Late Antique and Medieval World Antony Eastmond, 2015-04-20 Inscriptions convey meaning not just by their contents but also by other means such as choice of script, location, scale, spatial organisation, letterform, legibility, and clarity. The essays in this book consider these visual qualities of inscriptions ranging across the Mediterranean and the Near East, from Spain to Iran and beyond, including Norman Sicily, Islamic North Africa, Byzantium, medieval Italy, Georgia, and Armenia. While most essays focus on Late Antiquity and the Middle Ages, they also look back at Achaemenid Iran and forward to Mughal India. Topics discussed include real and pseudo writing, multilingual inscriptions, graffiti, writing disguised as images and images disguised as words. From public texts set up on mountainsides or on church and madrasa walls to intimate craftsmen's signatures barely visible on the undersides of precious objects, the inscriptions discussed in this volume reveal their meanings as textual and visual devices.

Writing History in the Medieval Islamic World Fozia Bora, 2019-06-13 In the encyclopaedic fourteenth-century Arabic chronicles produced in Mamluk cities bore textual witness to both recent and bygone history, including that of the Fatimids (969-1171 CE). For in two centuries of rule over Egypt and North Africa, the Isma'ili Fatimids had left few self-generated historiographical records. Instead, it fell to Ayyubid and Mamluk historians to represent the dynasty to posterity. This monograph sets out to explain how later historians preserved, interpreted, and reorganised earlier textual sources. Mamluk historians engaged in a sophisticated archival practice within historiography rather than uncritically reproducing earlier reports. In a new diplomatic edition, translation, and analysis of Mamluk historian Ibn al-Furat's account of late Fatimid rule in *The History of Dynasties and Kings*, a widely known but barely copied universal chronicle of Islamic history, Fozia Bora traces the survival of historiographical narratives from Fatimid Egypt. Through Ibn al-Furat's text, Bora demonstrates archivality as the heuristic key to Mamluk historical writing. This book is essential for all scholars working on the written culture and history of the medieval Islamic world and paves the way for a more nuanced reading of pre-modern Arabic chronicles and of the epistemic environment in which they were produced.

Shi'ism In South East Asia Chiara Formichi, Michael Feener, 2015-01-11 This is the first work available in any

language to extensively document and critically discuss traditions of Alid piety and their modern contestations in the region. The concept of Alid piety allows for a reframing of our views on the widespread reverence for Ali Fatima and their progeny that emphasizes how such sentiments and associated practices are seen as part of broad traditions shared by many Muslims which might or might not have their origins in a specifically Shi'a identity. In doing so it facilitates the movement of academic discussions out from under the shadow of polemical sectarian discourses on Shi'ism in Southeast Asia. The chapters include presentations of new material from previously unpublished early manuscript sources from Muslim vernacular literatures in the Malay Javanese Sundanese Acehnese and Bugis languages as well as rich new ethnography from across the region.
