Culinary Man and the Kitchen Brigade Jordan Fallon, 2024-09-23 Culinary Man and the Kitchen Brigade offers an exploration of the field of normative subjectivity circulated within western fine dining traditions presenting a theoretical analysis of the governing relationship between the chef who embodies the Culinary Man and the fine dining brigade The book offers a unique treatment of western haute cuisine s interlocking regime of labor and aesthetics and theorizes the underexplored kitchen brigade as a model of disciplinary formation It deploys a heterogeneous set of disciplinary discourses and practices which have the effect of consolidating monopolies on epistemic authority and governance Each position within the brigade's hierarchy is subject to distinct though related disciplinary practices.
