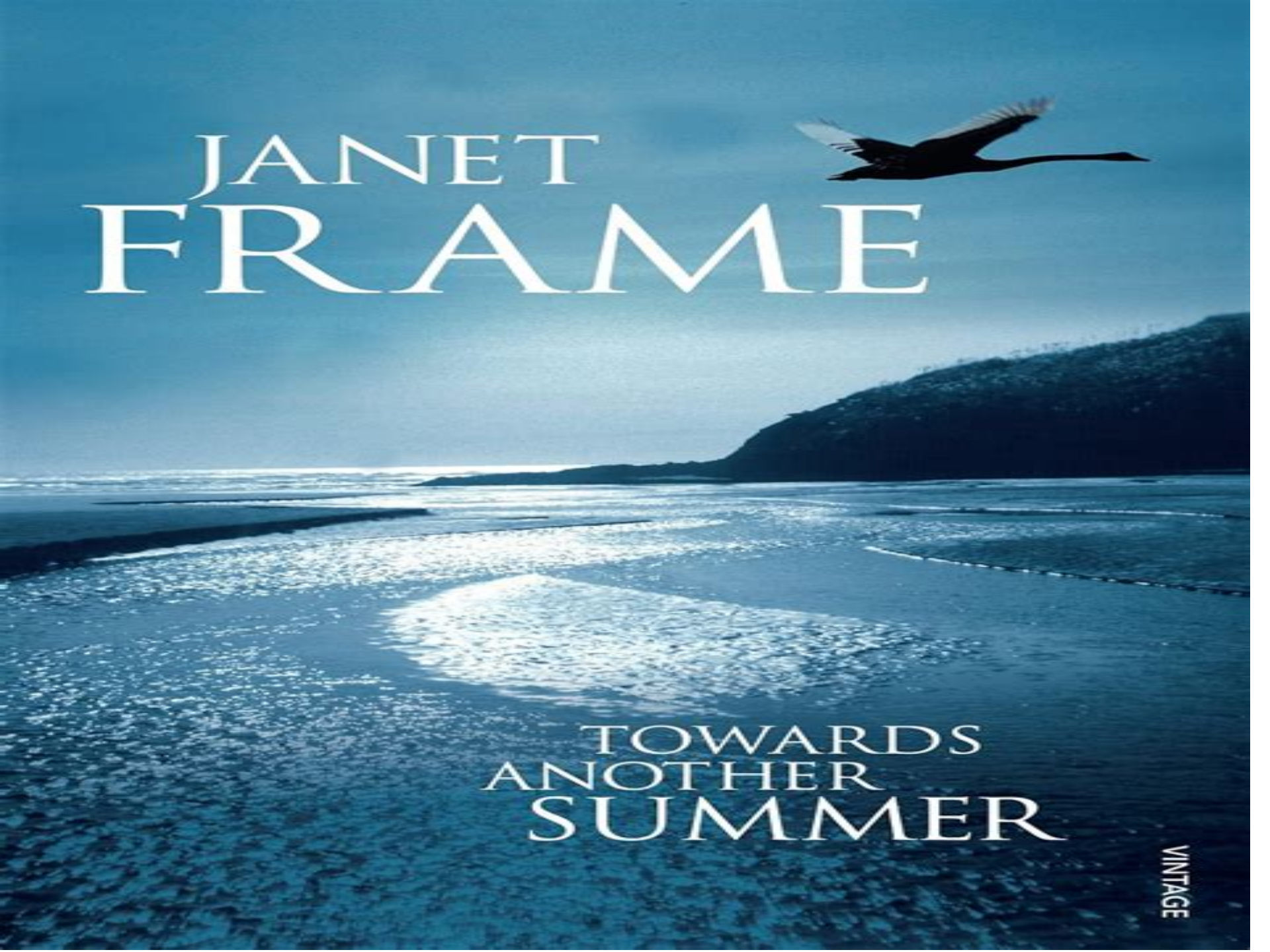

post imperial life writers Offering close sustained analysis of autobiographies memoirs travel narratives and autofictions and identifying new subgenres such as speculative life writing this book advances rich new readings of autobiographical narrative By tracing the continuing importance of colonialism to white subjectivity the role of imperial memory in Britain and the ways that these unsettling forces move beneath the surface of modern and contemporary literature this study offers new conceptual insights to the fields of life writing and postcolonial studies
