Examples abound: think Jackson Pollock dripping resin on a cicada carcass in his shed in the Hamptons. But times have changed ever since Andy Warhol declared his art space a factory; artists have begun to envision themselves as the leaders of production teams and their sense of what it means to be in the studio has altered just as dramatically as their practices. *The Studio Reader* pulls back the curtain from the art world to reveal the real activities behind artistic production. What does it mean to be in the studio? What is the space of the studio in the artist's practice? How do studios help artists envision their agency and beyond that their own lives? This forward-thinking anthology features an all-star array of contributors ranging from Svetlana Alpers, Bruce Nauman and Robert Storr to Daniel Buren, Carolee Schneemann and Buzz Spector, each of whom locates the studio both spatially and conceptually at the center of an art world that careens across institutions, markets and disciplines. The Art Gallery on Stage Mariacristina Cavecchi, 2024-03-21 Winner of the AIA Associazione Italiana di Anglistica Book Prize 2024 *The Art Gallery on Stage* is the first book to consider the representation of the art gallery on the contemporary British stage and to discuss how playwrights have begun to regard it as inspiration, location, focus or theme in an ever more intense game of cross-fertilization. The study analyzes the impact on dramatic form and theatrical presentation of what has been a paradigmatic shift in the way art galleries and museums display their collections and how these are perceived, establishing a hitherto unexplored connection between modes of exhibiting and modes of representation. It traces a trajectory from plays that were initially performed in traditional theatres in accordance with a naturalistic play structure to plays that favour a radical reconfiguration of visual representation. Indeed, since the beginning of the new millennium, playwrights and theatre makers have increasingly experimented with new dramatic forms and site-specific venues while forging collaborations with art makers and curators.

The book focuses on plays from the 1980s onwards such as Howard Barker's *Scenes from an Execution* Nick Dear's *The Art of Success* Alan Bennett's *A Question of Attribution* Timberlake Wertenbaker's *Three Birds Alighting on a Field* and *The Line* David Edgar's *Pentecost* Martin Crimp's *Attempt on Her Life* Rebecca Lenkiewicz's *Shoreditch* Madonna and *The Painter* David Leddy's *Long Live the Little Knife* and Tim Crouch's *My Arm An Oak Tree* and *England* and considers the vital contribution to the field made by set designers Ultimately through this study we come to understand how modern drama can offer a set of interpretative tools to enhance our understanding of the mechanisms underlying the social construction of art and furthermore the potential of theatre and the gallery space to question our fundamental cultural assumptions and values

The Politics of Expertise in Cultural Labour Karen Patel, 2020-03-16 What is expertise In the arts or cultural work the experts in this area are commonly regarded to be art critics dealers or intermediaries Why are they considered experts What about the expertise of the artists or cultural workers themselves *The Politics of Expertise in Cultural Labour* provides a much needed account of the concept of expertise in cultural work providing new insights into the individual experiences of cultural workers and the role of social media in their creative practice and development of expertise It also explores the potential reasons for inequalities in the sector which centre not only on protected characteristics such as class gender and race but increasingly the digital divide Drawing on interviews with cultural workers and an innovative social media analysis this book highlights the characteristics of aesthetic expertise in production the practical skills cultural workers hone and deploy over years of training and creative practice This is a new take on aesthetic expertise which is traditionally associated with those involved in the judgement of culture such as critics dealers and intermediaries The book highlights how social media platforms both enable and constrain the development of practical aesthetic expertise and the platforms role in the mediation of the cultural object online Finally Patel interrogates the power dimensions of expertise focusing primarily on gender Drawing on the work of Pierre Bourdieu it explores how opportunities to develop aesthetic expertise and the ability to use social media platforms to signal that expertise are not available to everyone In this sense *The Politics of Expertise in Cultural Labour* adds new perspectives to the growing body of work on inequalities in the creative and cultural industries as well as scholarship on social media and creative work The book concludes with the argument that the term expertise needs to be problematised and reclaimed by those who are not equally represented in the cultural industries using gender as a case in point

The Artist at Home

Imogen Racz, Jill Journeaux, 2024-01-11 Artists have worked from home for many reasons including care duties financial or political constraints or availability and proximity to others From the home studios of Charles and Ray Eames to the different photographic representations of Robert Rauschenberg's studio this book explores the home as a distinct site of artistic practice and the traditions and developments of the home studio as concept and space throughout the 20th and into the 21st century Using examples from across Europe and the Anglophone world between the mid 20th century and the present each chapter considers the different circumstances for working at home the impact on the creative lives of the artists their

identities as artists and on the work itself and how sometimes these were projected and promoted through photographs and the media Key themes include the gendered and performative aspects of women practising at home collaborative studio communities of the 1970s 90s including the appropriation of abandoned spaces in East London and the effects of Covid on artistic practices and family life within the spaces of home The book comprises full length chapters by artists architects art and design historians each of whom bring different perspectives to the issues interwoven with short interviews with artists to enrich and broaden the debates At a time when individual relationships to home environments have been radically altered The Artist at Home considers why some artists in previous decades either needed to or chose to work from home producing work of vitality and integrity Tracing this long tradition into the present the book will provide a deeper understanding of how the home studio has affected the practices and identity of artists working in different countries and in different circumstances from the mid 20th century to the present

A brief stay in France was for many Chinese workers and Chinese Communist Party leaders a vital stepping stone for their careers during the cultural and political push to modernize China after World War I For the Chinese students who went abroad specifically to study Western art and literature these trips meant something else entirely Set

against the backdrop of interwar Paris Paris and the Art of Transposition uncovers previously marginalized archives to reveal the artistic strategies employed by Chinese artists and writers in the early twentieth century transnational imaginary and to explain why Paris played such a central role in the global reception of modern Chinese literature and art While previous studies of Chinese modernism have focused on how Western modernist aesthetics were adapted or translated to the Chinese context Angie Chau does the opposite by turning to Paris in the Chinese imaginary and discussing the literary and visual artwork of five artists who moved between France and China the painter Chang Yu the poet Li Jinfa the art critic Fu Lei the painter Pan Yulian and the writer Xu Xu Chau draws the idea of transposition from music theory where it refers to shifting music from one key or clef to another or to adapting a song originally composed for one instrument to be played by another Transposing transposition to the study of art and literature Chau uses the term to describe a fluid and strategic art practice that depends on the tension between foreign and familiar new and old celebrating both novelty and recognition a process that occurs when a text gets placed into a fresh context

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
