show how it picked up momentum culminating in the Earth Liberation Front's 1998 arson at Vail Ski Resort which ended up doing more harm than good to the environmentalist cause by recasting the mega resorts as victims and turning public opinion against all environmental activists in the area As Americans weigh their desire for fresh powder against their concern for protecting unspoiled lands Childers's book provides valuable food for thought Colorado Powder Keg opens a new window on the history of skiing in the American West as it adds to the broader debate over the management and purpose of national forests
