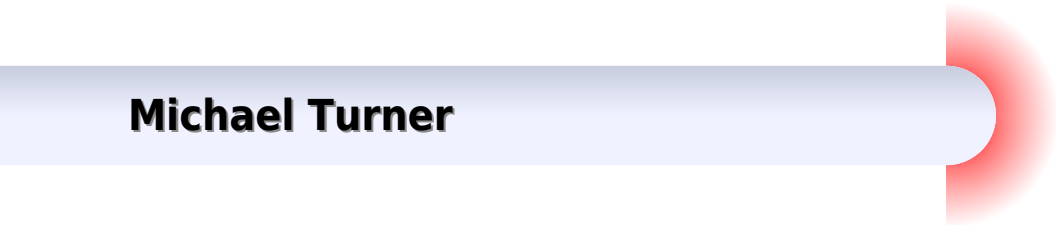

probe for weaknesses and explore alternatives Evaluating the inherent tensions between the methods and aims of intelligence personnel and policymakers from a unique insider s perspective Jervis forcefully criticizes recent proposals for improving the performance of the intelligence community and discusses ways in which future analysis can be improved
