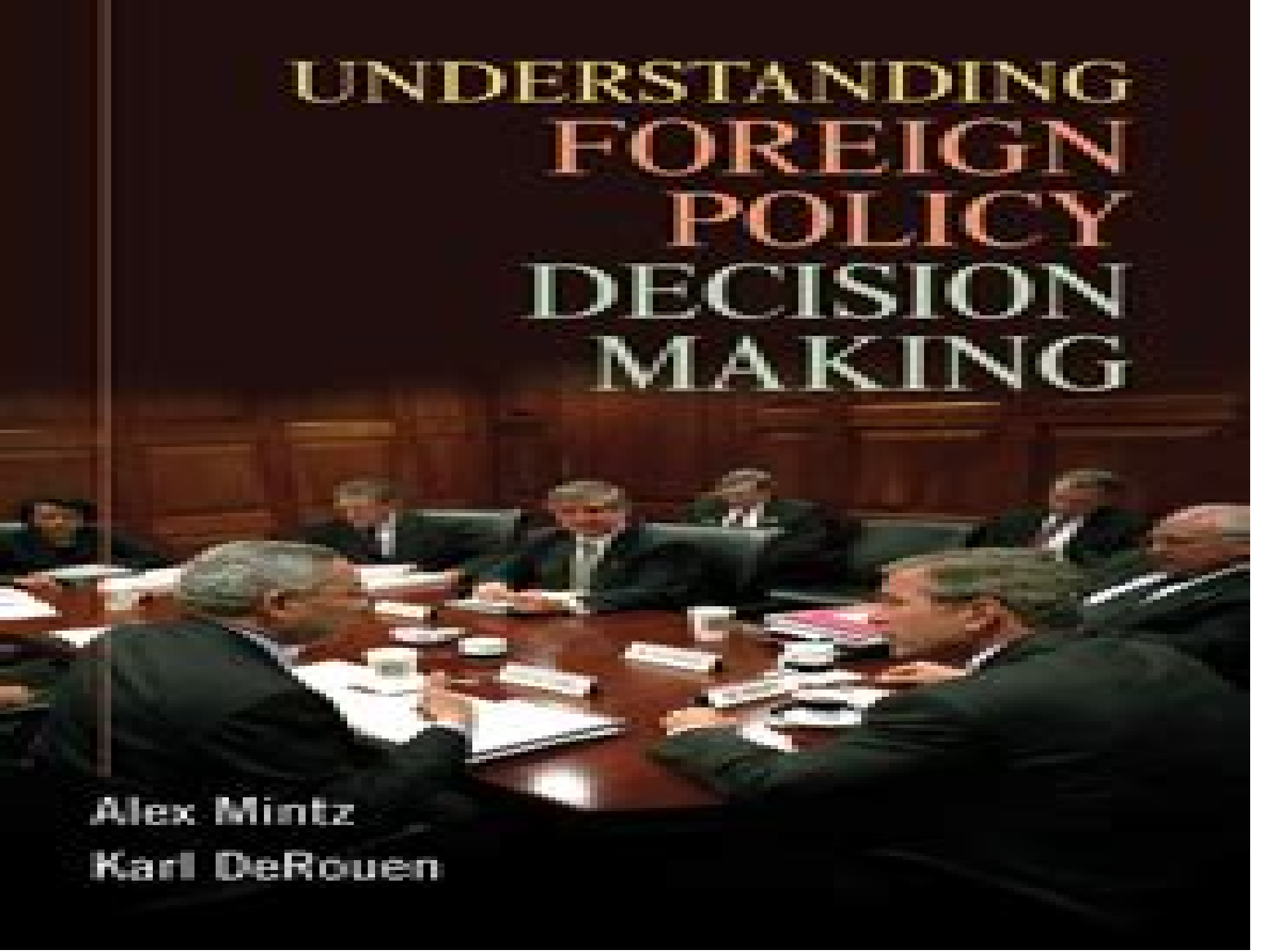

Rational Foreign Policy Decision-making Charles Todd Kent, 2006 This dissertation is an analysis of how presidents make foreign policy decisions Rather than explaining foreign policy decisions by focusing on individuals or institutions I stress the role of political pressures and context faced by presidents It shows that foreign policy decisions are not merely a reaction to stimulus from the international or domestic arenas but involve political considerations that affect policy choice The dynamic elements in the argument are political resources and risk The relationship between the risk propensity of the president and presidential political resources provides an important link to understanding foreign policy decisions Within the realm of good public policy a politically rational president can choose to act or respond to foreign policy disputes in various ways including diplomacy political coercion economic coercion covert action or military intervention based on his assessment of the political

context and his willingness to accept the associated risks The level of presidential political resources determines the risk propensity of the president Presidential foreign policy decisions will vary depending on the quantity of available political resources Thus understanding the risk propensity of the president increases our ability to explain foreign policy decisions The contribution of this research is the identification of a mechanism for understanding how the interaction between the domestic and international political environments and individual decision makers influence foreign policy decisions My research bridges the gap between structural theories theories that make predictions about foreign policy outcomes without reference to the cognition and actions of the actors themselves and decision making theories that stress the role of the actors Ikenberry 2002 5 Although the component parts of the foreign policy decision making system are widely known we lack theories that tie the pieces together

Explaining Foreign Policy Steve A. Yetiv,2011-03-01 Steve A Yetiv has developed an interdisciplinary integrated approach to studying foreign policy decisions which he applies here to understand better how and why the United States went to war in the Persian Gulf in 1991 and 2003 Yetiv s innovative method employs the rational actor cognitive domestic politics groupthink and bureaucratic politics models to explain the foreign policy behavior of governments Drawing on the widest set of primary sources to date including a trove of recently declassified documents and on interviews with key actors he applies these models to illuminate the decision making process in the two Gulf Wars and to develop theoretical notions about foreign policy What Yetiv discovers in addition to empirical evidence about the Persian Gulf and Iraq wars is that no one approach provides the best explanation but when all five are used a fuller and more complete understanding emerges Thoroughly updated with a new preface and a chapter on the 2003 Iraq War Explaining Foreign Policy already widely used in courses will continue to be of interest to students and scholars of foreign policy international relations and related fields

Theories of Dependent Foreign Policy and the Case of Ecuador in the 1980s Jeanne A. K. Hey,1995 How do economic weakness and dependence influence foreign policy decisions and behavior in third world countries Theories in Dependent Foreign Policy examines six foreign policy theories compliance consensus counterdependence realism leader preferences and domestic politics and each is applied to a series of case studies of Ecuador s foreign policy during the 1980s under two regimes Osvaldo Hurtado 1981 1984 and his successor Le n Febres Cordero 1984 1988 Hey shows that Ecuador during this period represented the third world in many ways It was a new democracy having just emerged from years of military rule extremely indebted to the West and dependent on primary product export economy that relied heavily on

importers especially the United States Jeanne Hey finds that some of the most popular and enduring theories in western research such as realism and compliance poorly account for Ecuadorian foreign policy She explains that poor countries like Ecuador have substantial foreign policy latitude in the diplomatic area Drawing on archival research and interviews with policy makers including Presidents Hurtado and Febres Cordero Dr Hey convincingly argues that many of the traditional foreign policy theories do not fit dependent states and inadequately account for the complexity of foreign policy in the third world

Renegades Regimes and Foreign Policy Crises Balkan Devlen,2008 The main puzzle that leads me to conceive this project is the seemingly irrational behavior of certain leaders like Slobodan Milosevic and Saddam Hussein during crises with the US Why did they risk war with the United States while the odds are clearly against them Why do they sometimes escalate the crisis to the point of war and sometimes seek conciliation and settlement Therefore the central question of this study is what are the dynamics behind the foreign policy behavior of renegade regimes rogue states during crises The cases include crises with Iraq 1991 Serbia 1999 and North Korea 1994 I created a theoretical framework that brings together psychological theories of foreign policy analysis and rational choice models and incorporates systemic and domestic constraints that leaders face to analyze their foreign policy behavior This book is primarily directed towards researchers interested in foreign policy international security and rogue states Policymakers in the foreign policy community journalists and people who are interested in how can we deal with emerging threats to peace and security hopefully would find this book helpful and informative
