Focusing on the unique history and context of Osage nation building efforts, this insightful ethnography provides a deeper vision of the struggles Native nation leaders are currently facing. Exploring the Osage philosophy of moving to a new country as a framework for relational governance, Jean Dennison shows that for the Osage nation building is an ongoing process of reworking colonial constraints to serve the nation's own ends. As Dennison argues, Osage officials have undertaken deliberate changes to strengthen Osage relations to their language, self-governance, health and land, core needs for a people to thrive now and into the future. Scholars and future Indigenous leaders can learn from the Osage Nation's past challenges, strategies and ongoing commitments to better enact the difficult work of Indigenous nation building.

The Queerness of Native American Literature Lisa Tatonetti, 2014-11-30 With a new and more inclusive perspective for the growing field of queer Native studies, Lisa Tatonetti provides a genealogy of queer Native writing after Stonewall. Looking across a broad range of literature, Tatonetti offers the first overview and guide to queer Native literature from its rise in the 1970s to the present day. In *The Queerness of Native American Literature*, Tatonetti recovers ties between two simultaneous renaissances of the late twentieth century: queer literature and Native American literature. She foregrounds how Indigeneity intervenes within and against dominant interpretations of queer genders and sexualities, recovering unfamiliar texts from the 1970s while presenting fresh, cogent readings of well-known works. In juxtaposing the work of Native authors—including the longtime writer-activist Paula Gunn Allen, the first contemporary queer Native writer Maurice Kenny, the poet Janice Gould, the novelist Louise Erdrich, and the filmmakers Sherman Alexie, Thomas Bezucha, and Jorge Manuel Manzano—with the work of queer studies scholars, Tatonetti proposes resourceful interventions in foundational concepts in queer studies while also charting new directions for queer Native studies. Throughout, she argues that queerness has been central to Native American literature for decades, showing how queer Native literature and Two Spirit critiques challenge understandings of both Indigeneity and sexuality.

Stories of Our Living Ephemera Emily Legg, 2023-12-15 *Stories of Our Living Ephemera* recovers the history of the Cherokee National Seminaries from scattered archives and colonized research practices by critically weaving together pedagogy and archival artifacts with Cherokee traditional stories and Indigenous worldviews. This unique text adds these voices to writing studies history and presents these stories as models of active rhetorical practices of assimilation resistance in colonized spaces. Emily Legg turns to the

Cherokee medicine wheel and cardinal directions as a Cherokee rhetorical discipline of knowledge making in the archives an embodied and material practice that steers knowledge through the four cardinal directions around all relations Going beyond historiography Legg delineates educational practices that are intertwined with multiple strands of traditional Cherokee stories that privilege Indigenous and matriarchal theoretical lenses Stories of Our Living Ephemera synthesizes the connections between contemporary and nineteenth century academic experiences to articulate the ways that colonial institutions and research can be Indigenized by centering Native American sovereignty By undoing the erasure of Cherokee literacy and educational practices Stories of Our Living Ephemera celebrates the importance of storytelling especially for those who are learning about Indigenous histories and rhetorics This book is of cultural importance and value to academics interested in composition and pedagogy the Cherokee Nation and a general audience seeking to learn about Indigenous rhetorical devices and Cherokee history
