The Book of Enoch Enoch,2022-10-23 The Book of Enoch is an ancient religious text traditionally ascribed to the Judeo-Christian prophet Enoch the ancestor of the biblical figure Noah Some scholars estimate that some parts of the book vary widely in age from several hundred years before Christ to the last parts in the century before the birth of Jesus This text is widely considered non canonical although it is accepted that it is a genuine attempt to record information as best the authors were able in the pre Christian era In the text Enoch is a figure who receives direct personal revelation from God He sees the magnificence of God and begins to preach to those around him against sin He warns that the sinners will be winnowed and that God himself will appear on Mount Sinai to judge the humans as well as the fallen angels on Earth Among the more controversial material within this text is the detailed account it gives of fallen angels on earth and their cursed offspring the Nephilim Azazel features heavily as the instigator of metal weapon production the use of cosmetics and advocate of widespread promiscuity and fornication In this book the figure of Enoch is charged with the knowledge of God s chosen and brutal punishment for the Nephilim their human mothers and their Angel fathers August Dillman s translation from the Ethiopian is part of his extensive work translating biblical era manuscripts and this particular version is augmented with his observations Latin excerpts and a stunning foreword by R H Charles One of the most important apocryphic works of the Second Temple Period is Enoch According to the biblical narrative Genesis 5 21-24 Enoch lived only 365 years far less than the other patriarchs in the period before the Flood Enoch walked with God then he was no more for God took him The original language of most of this work was in all likelihood Aramaic an early Semitic language Although the original version was lost in antiquity portions of a Greek translation were discovered in Egypt and quotations were known from the Church Fathers The discovery of the texts from Qumran Cave 4 has finally provided parts of the Aramaic original In the fragment exhibited here humankind is called on to observe how unchanging nature follows God s will The Book of Enoch is a pseudoepigraphal work a work that claims to be by a biblical character The Book of Enoch was not included in either the Hebrew or most Christian biblical canons but could have been considered a sacred text by the sectarians The original Aramaic version was lost until the Dead Sea fragments were discovered

oldest fragments of the book were found among the Dead Sea Scrolls and dated to roughly the second century B C This places the book squarely in the middle of what scholars call the Second Temple Period ca 500 B C 70 A D an era more commonly referred to as the Intertestamental Period This book will use the more academic designation Second Temple Period The Watcher story of 1 Enoch as many readers will recall is an expansion of the episode described in Genesis 6 1 4 where the sons of God Hebrew beney ha elohim came in to the daughters of man Gen 6 4 ESV Consequently Watchers is the Enochian term of choice among others for the divine sons of God While the story of this supernatural rebellion occupies scant space in Genesis it received considerable attention during the Second Temple Period The Enochian version of the events of Gen 6 1 4 preserves and transmits the original Mesopotamian context for the first four verses of the flood account Every element of Gen 6 1 4 has a Mesopotamian counterpoint a theological target that provides the rationale for why these four verses wound up in the inspired text in the first place Connections to that backstory can be found in the Old Testament but they are scattered and unsystematically presented This is not the case with Second Temple Jewish literature like 1 Enoch Books like 1 Enoch preserve all of the Mesopotamian touchpoints with Gen 6 1 4 when presenting their expanded retelling of the events of that biblical passage The Book of Enoch is therefore intended to be an important supplemental resource for assisting serious researchers and students in the study of the Bible A room without books is like a body without a soul A 19th century classics literature edition

Joseph Klaus,2020-08-06 Enoch Chanoch or Hanokh is the name given to one of the most peculiar and mysterious biblical characters in Scripture He was born according to the Jewish writings in the seventh generation after Adam being the son of Jared and father of Methuselah Enoch is the subject of many Jewish and Christian traditions He was considered the author of the Book of Enoch and also called Enoch the scribe of judgment According to the Hebrew written tradition called Tanakh reported in Genesis chapter 5 verses 22 24 Enoch would have been taken by God so that he would not experience death and would have been spared the wrath of the flood And Enoch walked with God after he begat Methuselah three hundred years and begat sons and daughters And all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty five years And Enoch walked with God and he appeared no more because God took him There are two extraordinary aspects in Enoch s account focused on in these verses which have not been focused on in other generations the indications in the text that he walked with God and the fact that he supposedly would not have died because God took him These accounts were the origin of many fables and midrashim deeper rabbinical studies of wise Jews over the centuries Many of them were very bothered by the fact that Enoch only lived 365 years a short life span for his time according to the book of Genesis About this biblical character there are also the apocryphal pseudoepigraphic books Book of Enoch I and Book of Enoch II which are part of the canon of some religious groups mainly the Christians of Ethiopia but which were rejected by the Christians because they were not inspired by the Holy Spirit and the Hebrews because they were particularly troublesome from the political point of view However the epistle of Judas in the biblical New Testament makes express mention of the Book of Enoch making a brief quotation in verses 14 and 15 of its single chapter According to The Book of Enoch with comparative study of the main translations there are several books attributed to Enoch three of which are the best known The Book of Enoch or Ethiopian Enoch or Enoch 1 The Second Book of Enoch or Slavonic Enoch and The Third Book of Enoch or Hebrew Enoch The best known is the first one which is included in the Ethiopian bible is considered authentic by the Jews of Ethiopia and was considered authentic by the Jews until about the year 200 having been part of the

Hebrew biblical corpus until that time and having been removed by a rabbi for several reasons including politics About 200 years later St Jerome in charge of creating the Christian bible based himself on the principle of Hebrew truth which meant that the books considered authentic by the Jews from the Old Testament were authentic For this reason the Book of Enoch fell into oblivion in the West until it was found more than a thousand years later The Book of Enoch Enoch 1 was first translated and published in Brazil in 1982 The Book of Enoch is extremely controversial because it addresses sexual and racial issues One of the controversies is that of the fallen angels who descended from heaven to have sexual relations with women they considered attractive and generated giants that destroyed the Earth Another polemic is that according to one passage Adam and Eve had black children and Adam was white which indicates that Eve was black According to the account in Genesis about the age of the patriarchs Seven and their children were still alive when Enoch was taken by God as well as Methuselah and Lamech
