The Making of Tocqueville's America Kevin Butterfield, 2015-11-19 Alexis de Tocqueville famously said that Americans were forever forming associations and saw in this evidence of a new democratic sociability though that seemed to be at odds with the distinctively American drive for individuality Yet Kevin Butterfield sees these phenomena as tightly related in joining groups early Americans recognized not only the rights and responsibilities of citizenship but the efficacy of the law A group Butterfield says isn't merely the people who join it it's the mechanisms and conventions that allow it to function and where necessary to regulate itself and its members Tocqueville then was wrong to see associations as the training grounds of democracy where people learned to honor one another's voices and perspectives rather they were the training grounds for increasingly formal and legalistic relations among people They were where Americans learned to treat one another impersonally

From Slavery to Poverty Gunja SenGupta, 2010-11 The racially charged stereotype of welfare queen an allegedly promiscuous waster who uses her children as meal tickets funded by tax payers is a familiar icon in modern America but as Gunja SenGupta reveals in From Slavery to Poverty her historical roots run deep For SenGupta argues the language and institutions of poor relief and reform have historically served as forums for inventing and negotiating identity Mining a broad array of sources on nineteenth century New York City's interlocking network of private benevolence and municipal relief SenGupta shows that these institutions promoted a racialized definition of poverty and citizenship But they also offered a framework within which working poor New Yorkers recently freed slaves and disfranchised free blacks Afro Caribbean sojourners and Irish immigrants sex workers and unemployed laborers and mothers and children could challenge stereotypes and offer alternative visions of community Thus SenGupta argues long before the advent of the twentieth century welfare state the discourse of welfare in its nineteenth century incarnation created a space to talk about community race and nation about what it meant to be American who belonged and who did not Her work provides historical context for understanding why today the notion of welfare with all its derogatory un-American connotations is associated not with middle class entitlements like Social Security and Medicare but rather with programs targeted at the poor which are wrongly assumed to benefit primarily urban African Americans

Abandoned Julie Miller, 2008-04-01 Two interesting items The author's article in New York Archives A letter regarding foundlings in The Riverdale Press In the nineteenth century foundlings children abandoned by their desperately poor typically unmarried mothers usually shortly after birth were commonplace in European society There were asylums in every major city to house abandoned babies and writers made them the heroes of their fiction most notably Charles Dickens's Oliver Twist In American cities before the Civil War the situation was different with foundlings relegated to the poorhouse instead of institutions designed specifically for their care By the eve of the Civil War New York City in particular had an epidemic of foundlings on its hands due to the rapid and often interlinked phenomena of urban development population growth immigration and mass poverty Only then did the city's leaders begin to worry about the welfare and future of its abandoned children In Abandoned Julie Miller offers a fascinating frustrating and often heartbreaking history of a once devastating now forgotten social problem that wracked America's biggest metropolis New York City Filled with anecdotes and personal stories Miller traces the shift in attitudes toward foundlings from ignorance apathy and sometimes pity for the children and their mothers to that of recognition of the problem as a sign of urban moral decline and in need of systematic intervention Assistance came from public officials and religious reformers who constructed four institutions the Nursery and Child's Hospital's foundling asylum the New York Infant Asylum the New York Foundling Asylum and the public Infant Hospital located on Randall's Island in the East River Ultimately the foundling asylums were unable to significantly improve children's lives and by the early twentieth century three out of the four foundling asylums had

closed as adoption took the place of abandonment and foster care took the place of institutions Today the word foundling has been largely forgotten Fortunately Abandoned rescues its history from obscurity *Mutiny at Fort Jackson* Michael D. Pierson, 2009-01-01 New Orleans was the largest city and one of the richest in the Confederacy protected in part by Fort Jackson which was just sixty five miles down the Mississippi River On April 27 1862 Confederate soldiers at Fort Jackson rose up in mutiny against their commanding officers New Orleans fell to Union forces soon thereafter Although the Fort Jackson mutiny marked a critical turning point in the Union's campaign to regain control of this vital Confederate financial and industrial center it has received surprisingly little attention from historians Michael Pierson examines newly uncovered archival sources to determine why the soldiers rebelled at such a decisive moment The mutineers were soldiers primarily recruited from New Orleans's large German and Irish immigrant populations Pierson shows that the new nation had done nothing to encourage poor white men to feel they had a place of honor in the southern republic He argues that the mutineers actively sought to help the Union cause In a major reassessment of the Union administration of New Orleans that followed Pierson demonstrates that Benjamin Butler enjoyed the support of many white Unionists in the city Pierson adds an urban working class element to debates over the effects of white Unionists in Confederate states With the personal stories of soldiers appearing throughout *Mutiny at Fort Jackson* presents the Civil War from a new perspective revealing the complexities of New Orleans society and the Confederate experience **Scraping By** Seth Rockman, 2009-01-29 Co winner 2010 Merle Curti Award Organization of American Historians Winner 2010 Philip Taft Labor History Book Award ILR School at Cornell University and the Labor and Working Class History Association Winner 2010 H L Mitchell Award Southern Historical Association Enslaved mariners white seamstresses Irish dockhands free black domestic servants and native born street sweepers all navigated the low end labor market in post Revolutionary Baltimore Seth Rockman considers this diverse workforce exploring how race sex nativity and legal status determined the economic opportunities and vulnerabilities of working families in the early republic In the era of Frederick Douglass Baltimore's distinctive economy featured many slaves who earned wages and white workers who performed backbreaking labor By focusing his study on this boomtown Rockman reassesses the roles of race and region and rewrites the history of class and capitalism in the United States during this time Rockman describes the material experiences of low wage workers how they found work translated labor into food fuel and rent and navigated underground economies and social welfare systems He also explores what happened if they failed to find work or lost their jobs Rockman argues that the American working class emerged from the everyday struggles of these low wage workers Their labor was indispensable to the early republic's market revolution and it was central to the transformation of the United States into the wealthiest society in the Western world Rockman's research includes construction site payrolls employment advertisements almshouse records court petitions and the nation's first living wage campaign These rich accounts of day laborers and domestic servants illuminate the history of early republic capitalism and
