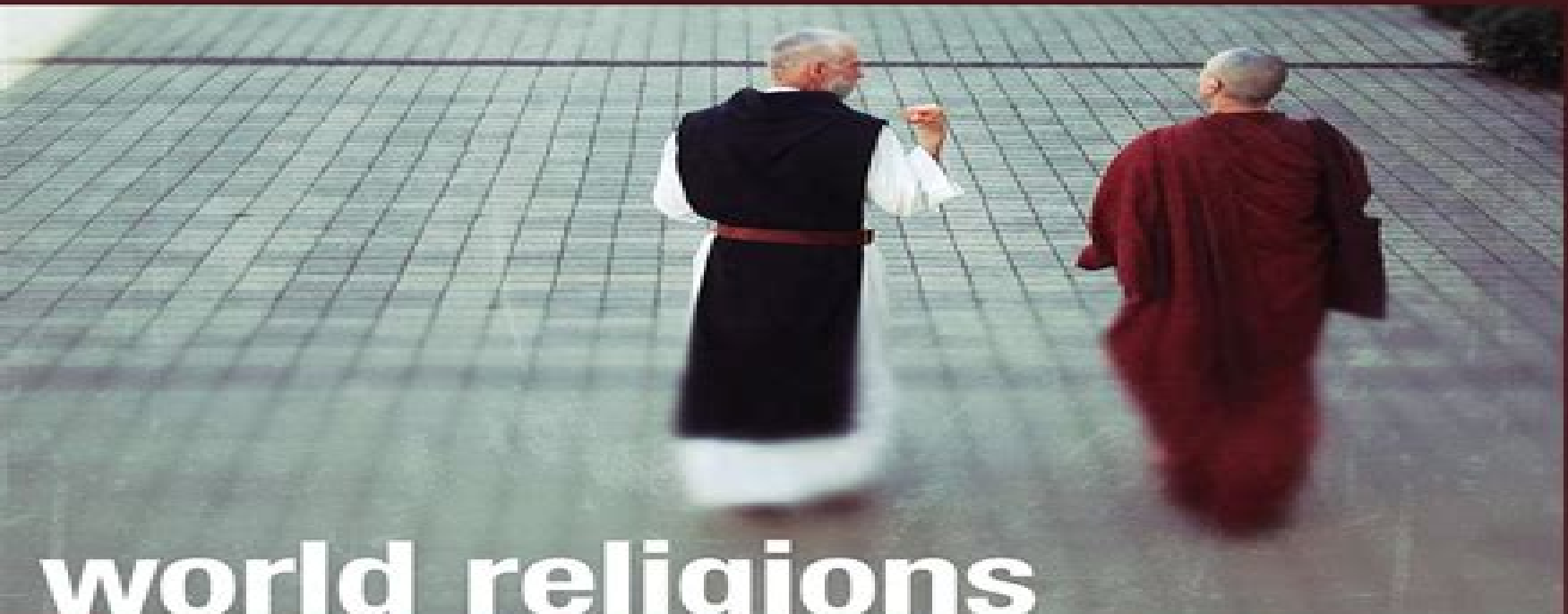

Faithful Interpretations Philip Geister, Gosta Hallonsten, 2021-02-26 Theology of Religions is among the most burning issues within Christian theology today The challenge to study and discuss different ways of handling conflicting truth claims and religious narratives between religions is taken up by a growing number of theologians across denominational boundaries This is a common and ecumenical effort undertaken by Christian theologians all over the world And yet the impact of specific ecclesiastical or theological traditions on different concepts of theology of religions should not be underestimated As well known the Second Vatican council with its pivotal decree *Nostra Aetate* On the relation to other religions not only set the agenda for Catholic theology but even influenced the wider discussion on the topic The papers of this volume were all given at a conference in Uppsala Sweden in October 2017 The structure of *Faithful Interpretations* follows closely the way the conference was conducted A general introduction to the development and present status of Theology of Religions by Marianne Moyaert opens the book Archbishop J Augustine Di Noia of the Vatican Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith then treats the recent developments in the teaching of the Magisterium regarding theology of religions Anna Bonta Moreland addresses the issue of Muhammad and Christian Prophecy Diego R Sarri Cucarella focuses on early Christian theological views of Islam and concludes that Islam has been from the beginning a disturbing factor in the Christian view of salvation history Wilhelmus G B M Valkenberg discusses the impact of *Nostra Aetate* on the Church s relation to Muslims using especially the precedent of Nicolaus of Cues as regards a constructive approach to Islam Klaus von Stosch addresses a sensitive issue in Muslim Christian relations and illustrates the advantages of the comparative theology approach for the theology of religions Complementing this perspective Peter Jonkers offers a hermeneutical perspective on truth claims and reflects on the religious Other with references to Jacques Derrida among others Reinhold Bernhardt argues in favour of a biblically grounded relational existential theory of truth which would be most helpful with regard to other religions To conclude the prominent Catholic specialist on Theology of Religions Gavin D Costa widened the perspective by addressing the relation to Judaism from the point of view of the covenant and the promises of the land Altogether the papers of this volume give a clear impression of the status of Roman Catholic Theology of Religions

interactions with Muslims of distinct sects in the Bronx community NYC schools and the workplace through the decades Aryeh observed how some professing Christians were led to believe in the Islamic claim of Muhammad's legitimacy as a prophet Although a few maintained the belief that Jesus remained holy as a prophet they suggested he was a mere man and abandoned their past confessions regarding his divinity Nevertheless the more astounding claim many ex Christians and Muslims made suggested that the Jewish and Christian God found in the Bible identified as the same deity of the Qur'an Hence these claims above initiated the primary reasons for delving deep into the study of Islam and writing this book for the sake of not only reaching many believers who erred from Christianity but the Muslims who believed that Allah identified as the God of the Jews and Christians Indeed the enormous task of disproving Islam as an extension of the Abrahamic faith required many investigations into the questions raised by such astonishing claims This book makes deep inquiries into the historical and theological assertions found in the Islamic faith concerning Allah Muhammad and the religious practices observed today which have survived for little over fourteen centuries Consequentially the unfortunate misconceptions taught about Islam in many church pulpits since the early days of this researcher's youth stemmed from books found in academia and some Christian libraries which promoted a worldwide narrative by selective favorable historical accounts based on political ideologies instead of rigorous theological investigation The Christian perspective on Islam examines the theological origins of the Islamic faith by first investigating the geographical locations alleged as the nascent religion's early beginnings by exploring the historical and societal development of the Arab peoples Second this book probes the legitimacy of Muhammad as a divinely ordered prophet by consulting the Judaic traditions derived from the Jewish Scriptures explaining the qualifications of authentic prophethood Finally the sequential order of inquiry laid out above will highlight the emergence of the theology and residual religious rituals observed today in the Islamic world and therefore conclusively demonstrate that Islam remains unaligned with its Jewish and Christian predecessors WHEN--Questions for Catholicism Michael J. Magdalena Shaw,Ronald Allen Baatsen,Johannes Janse van Rensburg,Tessa Freeman,2017-11-23 In the public theology discourse the concept public square has become significant In today s multicultural and globalised world it is inevitable that people with different religious affiliations will encounter one another in the public square Public theology cannot but become theology of religions Scholars in the field of religion studies are compelled to reflect theologically on the relevance of religiosity in the postmodern secular world The term theology of religions refers to the academic inquiry into the relationship between religions The collected essays constitute such an inquiry In the end it is not so much about the encounter of religions but rather of people Religion is no longer regarded as a monolithic body of beliefs and practices The authors concede that the concept religion is too fluid to be delineated precisely The book s approach to the relationship between religions i e theology of religions reflects how the authors understand the origin and nature of religion a theology of religion in the singular This book focuses more on theology of religions plural than on theology of religion singular The main objective of the book is to present a variety of perspectives on how theology of religions manifested in different contexts This includes historical i e Luther s theology of religions and the Roman Catholic position on other religions as taken by Vatican II as well as cultural and religious perspectives In the first chapter the editor gives a brief overview of the development of the discipline of theology of religions The postmodern era is characterised by an almost non foundational approach The second chapter traces the development of the discipline in the Roman Catholic tradition in particular This contribution is based on the insights of P J van der Merwe 1944 2014 who as researcher and Head of the Department of Science of Religion and Missiology at the University of Pretoria developed a specific theological position on non Christian religions A whole generation of theologians was trained in this school of thought He passed away in 2014 and this publication pays tribute to his life s work on religions and their relations The contributions that follow are the culmination of the research of postgraduate students at the University of Pretoria The third chapter presents a perspective on the Reformation with a particular focus on Martin Luther In this year of the quincentenary anniversary of the Reformation the legacy of Reformed belief is highlighted The fourth chapter describes the relationship between Christianity and Islam from the perspective of a willingness to embrace The fifth chapter analyses the relation between Christianity Judaism and Islam from the perspective of intergroup threat theory A model for theology of religions in a South African context is developed in the sixth and final chapter This scholarly book pays tribute to the academic contribution of P J van der Merwe mentor of the authors of these multifaceted reflections on theology of religions The target audience is specialists in the field of religion studies The distinctive contribution of the book is the innovative perspectives on the relationship between Islam and Christianity in both the Roman Catholic and Protestant contexts Comparative Theology in the Millennial Classroom Mara Brecht,Reid B Locklin,2015-12-07 This volume explores the twenty first century classroom as a uniquely intergenerational space of religious disaffiliation and questions about how our work in the classroom can be and is being re imagined for the new generation The
