Topic 3.1 Empires Expand

Learning Objective.

Explain how and why various land-based empires developed and expanded from 1450 to 1750.

Historical Developments

Imperial expansion relied on the increased use of gunpowder, cannons, and armed trade to establish large empires in both hemispheres.

Land empires included the Manchal in Central and East Asia; the Machal in South and Central Asia; the Ottoman in Southern Europe, the Middle East, and North Africa; and the Satavida in the Middle East.

Political and religious disputes led to rivalries and conflict between states.

State displaces:

- Safavid-Mughal conflict.
- Songhai Empire's conflict with Morpoco

Explain how the land-based empires of the 1450-1750 time period developed (what allowed them to obtain and maintain power): The land-based empires of the 1450-1750 time period obtained and maintained power through military conquests, strong centralized governments, religious and cultural achievements, and economic prosperity. These Gunpowder empires were known for obvs gunpowder technology, which allowed them to employ more advanced military conquests and weaponry, further solidifying their power and influence.

Describe the Qing Dynasty (use SPICE-T characteristics): The last imperial dynasty of China, ruling from 1644 to 1912. The dynasty was founded by the Manchu people, who invaded China and established the dynasty after the collapse of the Ming Dynasty. The Qing Dynasty is known for its military conquests, economic prosperity, and cultural achievements, including the completion of the Grand Canal and the development of the arts, such as porcelain and painting.

Describe the Mughal Empire (use SPICE-T characteristics): A Muslim empire that ruled much of South Asia from the early 16th to the mid-19th century. The Mughals were of Central Asian descent and established a powerful and wealthy empire that was characterized by religious tolerance, artistic and architectural achievements, and a rich cultural heritage. The Mughal Empire was known for its impressive military conquests, including the expansion of their empire into much of present-day India, as well as for its contributions to the arts, such as the construction of the Taj Mahal.

Describe the Ottoman Empire (use SPICE-T characteristics): The Ottoman Empire was a Sunni Muslim empire that spanned three continents, ruling from the late 13th century to the early 20th century. The empire was founded by Osman I, a Turkic warrior who established a powerful state in Anatolia. The Ottoman Empire is known for its military conquests, religious tolerance, and cultural achievements, including the construction of many impressive mosques, palaces, and other
