Unity and Diversity in Language Use Kristyan Miller, Paul Thompson, 2006-01-23 The papers in this collection drawn from the 34th Annual Conference of the British Association for Applied Linguistics reflect a number of different perspectives within the field of applied linguistics at the start of the twenty first century. While addressing the theme of unity and diversity each paper prompts critical reflection on tensions within the discipline between stability and change consensus and controversy similarity and variation The interpretation of language use is broad and varied taking both macro and micro perspectives Topics addressed range from issues of global communication in a world of shifting demographies and technological advances to analyses of specific contexts of interaction both professional and personal Contexts of language use frequently coincide with settings of language acquisition both within and beyond the language classroom and this opens up discussion of the focus scope and appropriateness of research stances in applied linguistics and practices in language pedagogy Futhermore variation is considered from a number of social cultural gender related linguistic and discourse perspectives calling into question terminology definitions and the nature of evidence at the heart of applied linguistic theory Language in Use Loredana Frățilă, 2010-04-16 Language in Use The Case of Youth Entertainment and practice Magazines is a collection of seven studies by several Romanian Bulgarian and Slovenian linguists on the discourse of entertainment magazines targeted at young readers and published in their respective countries. The starting point of the seven studies was the idea that the discourse specific to the variety of printed media products selected for analysis was characterized by distinctive features and that these features might exert a manipulative influence on the linguistic and social behavior of the targeted readership The scholars initial aim was to validate these hypotheses and to confirm their soundness across countries However they hope that besides suggesting new perspectives on the discourse chosen for analysis and thus filling a gap in the eastern European literature in the field they may also develop admittedly within limits media literacy in young readers by equipping them with skills that could transform them from passive media consumers into responsible readers able to make informed decisions and thus be less vulnerable to the strategies of manipulation employed by those who control information The Phraseological View of Language Thomas Herbst, Susen Faulhaber, Peter Uhrig, 2011-11-30 This volume presents the results of the international symposium Chunks in Corpus Linguistics and Cognitive Linguistics held at the University of Erlangen Nuremberg to honour John Sinclair's contribution to the development of linguistics in the second half of the twentieth century The main theme of the book highlighting important aspects of Sinclair's work is the idiomatic character of language with a focus on chunks in the sense of prefabricated items as extended units of meaning To pay tribute to Sinclair's enormous impact on research in this field the volume contains two contributions which deal explicitly with his work including material from unpublished manuscripts Beyond that the articles cover different aspects of chunks ranging from more theoretically oriented to more applied papers in which foreign language teaching and the computational
