Foreign Worlds Carole Levin,John Watkins,2012-06-15 In Shakespeare s Foreign Worlds Carole Levin and John Watkins focus on the relationship between the London based professional theater preeminently associated with William Shakespeare and an unprecedented European experience of geographic social and intellectual mobility Shakespeare s plays bear the marks of exile and exploration rural depopulation urban expansion and shifting mercantile and diplomatic configurations He fills his plays with characters testing the limits of personal identity foreigners usurpers outcasts outlaws scolds shrews witches mercenaries and cross dressers Through parallel discussions of Henry VI The Taming of the Shrew and The Merchant of Venice Levin and Watkins argue that Shakespeare s centrality to English national consciousness is inseparable from his creation of the foreign as a category asserting dangerous affinities between England s internal minorities and its competitors within an increasingly fraught European mercantile system As a women s historian Levin is particularly interested in Shakespeare s responses to marginalized sectors of English society As a scholar of English Italian Studies and Medieval Studies Watkins situates Shakespeare in the context of broadly European historical movements Together Levin and Watkins narrate the emergence of the foreign as portable category that might be applied both to strangers from other countries and to native born English men and women such as religious dissidents who resisted conformity to an increasingly narrow sense of English identity Shakespeare s Foreign Worlds will appeal to historians literary scholars theater specialists and anyone interested in Shakespeare and the Elizabethan Age

The Works of William Congreve Donald McKenzie,2011-04-07 The late D F

McKenzie worked on this comprehensive edition of the works of the playwright poet librettist and novelist William Congreve for more than twenty years until his sudden death in 1999. This was a task he had taken over from Herbert Davis to whom this edition is dedicated. During that time McKenzie uncovered new verse and letters, collated Congreve's texts, recorded their complicated textual history, constructed appendices that shed light on the dramatic context in which Congreve worked, and examined how his contemporaries received Congreve's work. More importantly, McKenzie has convincingly re-evaluated Congreve's works and life to transform our image of the man and his reputation. McKenzie here follows the editorial practice suggested in two early editions of the Works published by Congreve's friend the bookseller Jacob Tonson in 1710 and 1719. These three volumes follow a plan similar to that in the Tonson edition with *The Old Batchelor*, *The Double Dealer*, and *Love for Love* collected in the first, a central volume with *The Way of the World*, and a final volume with Congreve's novel *Incognita*, some of his prose works, letters, and later verse. In each case Congreve's work is left to speak for itself, unencumbered by intrusive notes, textual apparatus, or collations which are gathered instead near the end of each volume. This edition will be an invaluable resource for scholars for many years to come. It is a monument to McKenzie's own scholarship as well as to the integrity of William Congreve.

Julian Goodare sets out an original interpretation of witch hunting as an episode of ideologically driven persecution by the godly state in the era of the Reformation and Counter Reformation. Full weight is also given to the context of village social relationships, and there is a

detailed analysis of gender issues Witch hunting was a legal operation and the courts rationale for interrogation under torture is explained Panicking local elites rather than central governments were at the forefront of witch hunting Further chapters explore folk beliefs about legendary witches and intellectuals beliefs about a secret conspiracy of witches in league with the Devil Witch hunting eventually declined when the ideological pressure to combat the Devil s allies slackened A final chapter sets witch hunting in the context of other episodes of modern persecution This book is the ideal resource for students exploring the history of witch hunting Its level of detail and use of social theory also make it important for scholars and researchers

Plagues, poisons and potions William G. Naphy,2021-02-02 *Plagues poisons and potions* highlights one of the most fascinating aspects of the history of early modern plague In the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries outbreaks of plague in and around the ancient Duchy of Savoy led to the arrests of many people who were accused of conspiring to spread the disease Those implicated in the conspiracies were usually poor female migrants working in the plague hospitals under the direction of educated professional male barber surgeons These conspirators were subsequently tried for spreading plague among leading and wealthy people from urban areas so that they could rob them while the afflicted homeowners were confined to their beds In order to understand how this phenomenon developed and was regarded at the time this study examines the courts the judiciary and the part played by torture in the trials which frequently

concluded with the spectacular and gruesome execution of the suspects The author goes on to consider the socio economic conditions of the workers and in doing so highlights an early modern form of class warfare However what makes this phenomenon especially interesting is that in an age dominated by superstition religious strife and witch hunts the conspiracies were always given a more rational explanation and motivation profit Both teachers and students of early modern history will be fascinated by this enlightening study into the fears of European society the spread of the disease and the judicial procedures of the time **Controlling Misbehavior in England, 1370-1600** Marjorie Keniston
