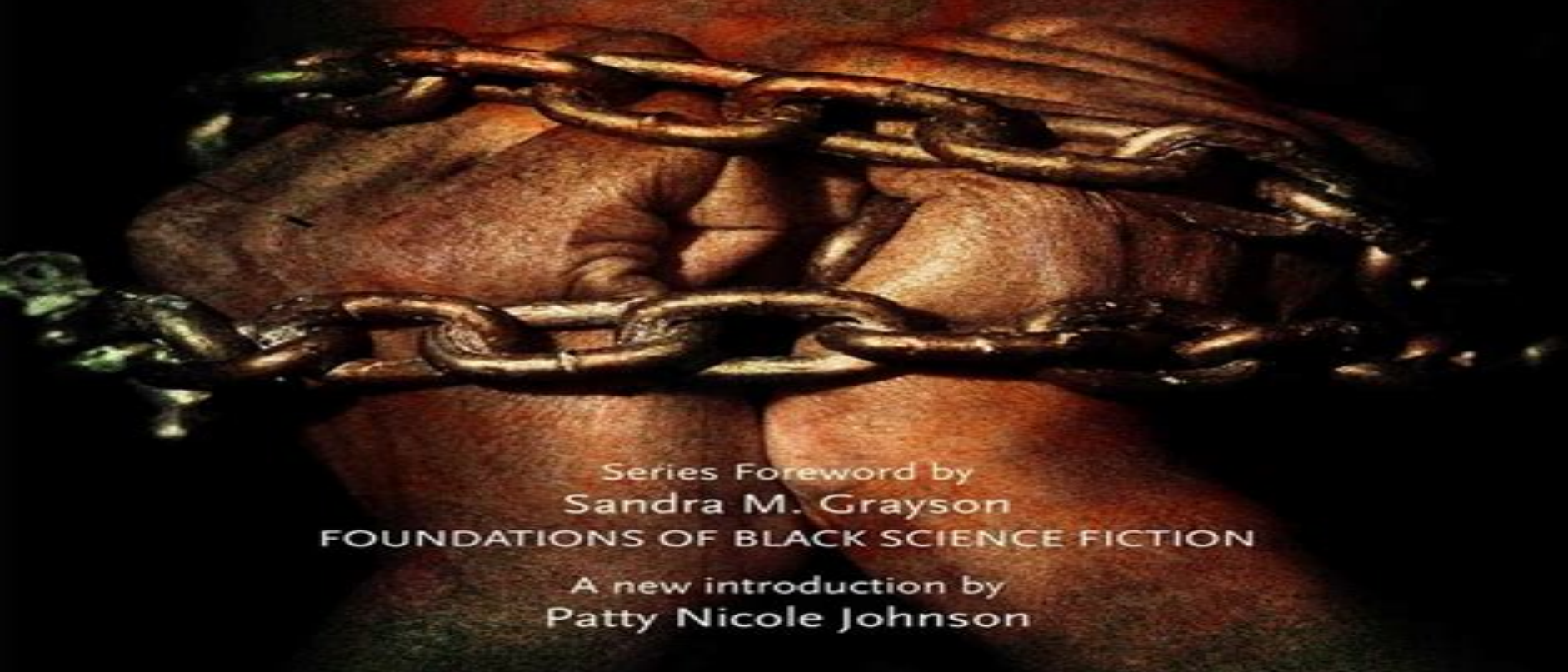

1807 c 1875 was an American abolitionist and writer best remembered for his powerful race memoir *Twelve Years a Slave* At the age of 32 when he was a married farmer father of three violinist and free born man he was kidnapped in Washington D C and shipped to New Orleans sold to a planter and enslaved for a dozen years When he gained his freedom he wrote his famous memoir and spent some years lecturing across the US on behalf of the abolitionist movement *Twelve Years a Slave* was published a year after *Uncle Tom's Cabin* by Harriet Beecher Stowe and built on the anti slavery momentum it had developed Northup's final years are something of a mystery though it is thought that he struggled to cope with family life after being freed
