The book is written for students with basic knowledge about case constituent tests and simple phrase structure grammars advanced BA or MA level and for researchers with an interest in the Germanic languages and or an interest in Head Driven Phrase Structure Grammar Sign Based Construction Grammar without having the time to deal with all the details of these theories **Encyclopaedia of German diatheses** Michael Cysouw, 2023-03-14 Diathesis valency alternation is a sentence structure that reshapes the roles of a verb The prototypical example of such a diathesis is the well known passive However there are very many other such role remappings like antipassives applicatives causatives etc This book presents an encyclopaedic survey of diathesis in German The objective is to catalogue all diatheses that exist in this language Currently almost 250 different German diatheses are described in this book some highly productive some only attested for a handful of verbs The main goal of this book is to present this wealth of grammatical possibility in a unified manner while at the same time attempting to classify and organise this diversity A summary of the about 80 most prominent diatheses is also provided including many newly minted German names because most these diatheses did not have a German name yet It might come as a surprise that there are so many different diatheses in German but my impression is that in this respect German is no exception among the world's languages I expect that all languages have a similar abundance of different ways in which to construe a sentence around a lexical predicate In a sense a diathesis allows for the expression of a distinct perspective on the event described something that is arguably a common desire of any language user Except for diathesis this book also aims to completely catalogue its counterpart epithesis An epithesis is a derived sentence structure in which the marking of the verb roles remains constant Basically these are the grammaticalised constructions expressing tense aspect mood evidentiality in German The list of major epitheses is also quite long about 40 constructions but it is quite a bit

smaller than the list of major diatheses about 80 constructions This indicates that from a purely grammatical perspective diathesis grammatical voice is about a two times more elaborate topic than epithesis tense aspect mood marking in German

The results of four rating studies on topic drop in different prefield configurations lead to a refined prefield condition based on proposals by Rizzi 1994 and Freywald 2020 that is independent of topicality Moreover they inform the discussion on the most suitable syntactic analysis of topic drop supporting a PF deletion approach The second part of the book presents and tests an information theoretic account of topic drop usage that builds on the Uniform Information Density hypothesis Levy Jaeger 2007 In a corpus study and seven rating studies several potential usage factors are investigated including grammatical person and verb predictability. The results provide initial evidence suggesting that topic drop usage can be explained by general processing principles. The prefield constituent is omitted when it is redundant and realized overtly when it facilitates the processing of the following verb This information theoretic explanation is based on independently evidenced processing mechanisms bundles isolated claims from the theoretical literature and allows for a unified analysis of topic drop with other types of ellipsis and reduction

Expletive and Referential Subject Pronouns in Medieval French Michael Zimmermann,2014-09-12 Medieval French usually analyzed as a null subject language differs considerably from modern Romance null subject languages such as Spanish in the availability of non expressed subject pronouns specifically it shows characteristics reminiscent of non null rather than null subject languages such as the expression of expletive subject pronouns The central goal of this book is to put forward an account of these differences On the basis of the analysis of an extensive newly established data corpus the development of the expression of both expletive and referential subject pronouns until the 17th c is determined Following a thorough discussion of previous approaches an alternative approach is presented which builds on the analysis of Medieval French as a non null subject language The non expression of subject pronouns licit in specific contexts in non null subject

Inner-sentential Propositional Proforms Werner Frey, André Meinunger, Kerstin Schwabe, 2016-07-26 This book deals with sentential proforms and their relationship to their associated clauses Sentential proforms are highly interesting from the point of view of grammatical theory since their occurrence is determined not only by syntax but also by prosody and semantics The present volume contributes to a better understanding of the interfaces between these different levels By providing syntactic prosodic semantic psycholinguistic and corpus based support this book underpins the claim that there exist different sentential proform types in German and Dutch that these proform types correlate with different verb classes and that their associated related clauses are located in different syntactic positions. Petzell, 2022-03-16 This volume explores morphosyntactic change in the Late Modern Swedish period from the 18th century and onwards This period is interesting for a number of reasons This is when Swedish is established as a national standard language New genres emerge and the written language becomes more generally available to all speakers We also sometimes find diverging developments in the different North Germanic languages and some of the much discussed differences between Danish Norwegian and Swedish are established during this period In addition during the 19th and 20th centuries the traditional dialects undergo more dramatic changes than ever Yet the Late Modern Swedish period has previously received fairly little attention in the syntactic literature This volume aims to remedy this with studies that cover several different grammatical domains including case and verbal syntax word order and agreement and grammaticalization in the nominal domain The study by Cecilia Falk investigates the possibility of promoting an indirect object to subject in a passive that emerges during the period A chapter by Fredrik Valdeson studies change in the use of ditransitive verbs from a constructional perspective Three chapters are concerned with word order change The study by Ida Larsson and Bj rn Lundquist investigates the development of a strict word order in particle constructions Adrian Sangfelt studies the possibility of having adverbials and other constituents between the separate verbal heads in complex VPs in the final stages of the shift from OV to VO order Erik M Petzell investigates embedded verb placement and agreement morphology in the Viskadalian dialect which on the surface seems to contradict the Rich Agreement Hypothesis Mikael Kalm discusses the emergence of different kinds of adverbial infinitival clauses in the standard written language compared to vdalian Finally the study by Lars Olof Delsing is concerned with a case of grammaticalization in the nominal domain specifically the development of the gradable adjectives mycket much and lite little into quantifiers The Next Phase in Heritage Language Studies: Methodological Considerations and
