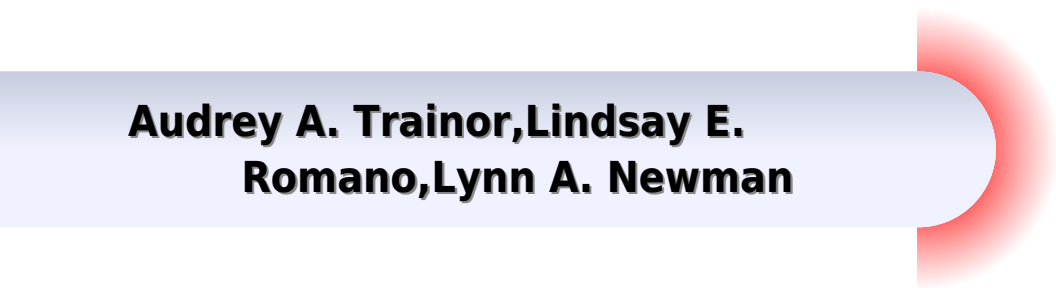

Whitaker,2018 Since the inception of the Americans with Disabilities Act ADA of 1990 there has been a steady increase in the enrollment of students with disabilities in higher education With the postsecondary transition in educational supports from the Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act IDEA in high school to ADA in college there has been a lack of research related to the experiences of these students with disabilities while they are in college Considering the changes in disability experience resulting from education policy changes from high school IDEA to college ADA Section 504 the purpose of this study was to examine the experiences of first year students with disabilities at four year higher education institutions This study utilized components from Disability Studies in Education approach Disability Critical Race Studies DisCrit Acculturation and Diverse Learning Environment frameworks in analyzing first year students with disabilities experiences Using a mixed methods approach to investigate both attitudes and perceptions the researcher conducted a survey of 63 students representing five colleges and focus group interviews with 43 students representing three colleges Findings indicate that first year students with disabilities are assimilating into the mainstream non disabled culture in higher education First year students with disabilities heavily rely on adult s parents or disability service personnel knowledge in educational decision making Additionally the findings also highlight the impact of fee based specialized disability programs on first year student experiences and perceptions of campus climate This study contributes to the understanding of the conditions that support and challenge the higher education experiences of first year students with disabilities The findings also highlight a need for more research examining a broader range of disability categories and the intersection of disability and race **Postsecondary Education and Transition for Students with Learning Disabilities** Loring Cowles

Shaw,2002 **Preparing high school students with disabilities to successfully transition to postsecondary education** Jessica Marzi,2015 Research has shown that students with learning disabilities are not prepared to successfully transition to postsecondary education The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act IDEA recognizes the importance of postsecondary preparation and requires transition planning for eligible students This project reflects the background of students with disabilities transitioning to higher education and utilizes the American School Counselor Association National Model to recommend improvements to the current preparatory methods for students with

learning disabilities These improvements include the varying informational needs for students educators and parents during the process in an effort to help students find postsecondary success and close the achievement gap between students with learning disabilities and their non disabled peers

Transition Planning for Postsecondary Students with Disabilities Roberta Rusch Dorow, 2010 The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act IDEA of 2004 mandated transition planning services for students with disabilities who are exiting high school and entering the world of work or postsecondary education Despite collaborative efforts between educational institutions and various service agencies to facilitate transition from high school to employment or continued education students with disabilities appear to lag behind their non handicapped peers in these areas This study focused on transition planning for students with mild disabilities enrolled in a community college in central Texas The individual transition plans ITPs of fifteen students who had self declared to the college as having a learning disability were obtained from the high school from which they graduated The records were analyzed for evidence of twelve essential components of transition planning recommended in educational literature The students were interviewed regarding their vi i transition plans and what they viewed as factors necessary for success in college Four professional staff members of the Education Support Service which serves students with disabilities on campus were also interviewed regarding how prepared the students were for college work and what factors that promote college success should be included in adequate transition plans The study investigated the adequacy and fit of transition planning as an effective means of preparing students with disabilities for the reality of postsecondary education Knowledge gained from this study could assist public school special educators to develop appropriate ITPs and inform practice in the field of secondary special education in areas such as curriculum collaboration with service agencies and assessment of transition service needs

The Transition from Secondary to Postsecondary Education for Students with Disabilities Susan A. Marine, 2014 The purpose of this phenomenological study was to explore the transition from secondary to postsecondary education for students with disabilities A comparison was made between participants with invisible and visible disabilities After the data were analyzed several themes and sub themes and commonalities in the perceptions of the six participants of this study were discovered Those themes were student expectations to attend college transition cultural shock perceptions of disability support systems high school and college accommodations disability support services and coping strategies The results of this study revealed that family friends and the social environment played a role in the decision for the disabled participants to attend college Another finding was that participants with invisible disabilities experienced transition culture shock while participants with visible disabilities did not Some participants with invisible disabilities experienced difficulties forming relationships with peers whereas participants with visible disabilities experienced minimal problems Participants with invisible disabilities held

negative perceptions of themselves whereas participants with visible disabilities held minimal. Regarding external perceptions, all participants, invisible and visible, perceived that society may hold negative views about people with disabilities. Participants with visible disabilities did not rely as much on social capital for support as did the participants with invisible disabilities. Participants with invisible disability reported having similar services or accommodations in college as they did in high school. There were mixed views held by participants with invisible disabilities regarding the services they received from the retention center. Finally, participants with visible disabilities displayed all aspects of self empowerment while participants with invisible disabilities lacked some of the components of self empowerment.
