The Whiskey Trade of the Northwestern Plains Margaret Anne Kennedy, 1997 The last stage of the fur trade of North America's northwestern plains in which native people played a decisive role is known as the whiskey trade due to the overwhelming use of alcohol as a commodity of exchange In the 1860s and 1870s hundreds of trading posts were established throughout northern Montana and southern Alberta and Saskatchewan by independent American traders seeking buffalo robes processed by the women of local native groups This study combines evidence from history archaeology and native oral traditions to present new insight on this most important yet rarely studied episode in the North American fur trade

Wylie, 2016-02-26 On the morning of January 23 1870 troops of the 2nd U S Cavalry

attacked a Piegan Indian village on the Marias River in Montana Territory killing many more than the army's count of 173 most of them women children and old men The village was afflicted with smallpox Worse it was the wrong encampment Intended as a retaliation against Mountain Chief's renegade band the massacre sparked public outrage when news sources revealed that the battalion had attacked Heavy Runner's innocent village and that guides had told its inebriated commander Major Eugene Baker he was on the wrong trail but he struck anyway Remembered as one of the most heinous incidents of the Indian Wars the Baker Massacre has often been overshadowed by the better known Battle of the Little Bighorn and has never received full treatment until now Author Paul R Wylie plumbs the history of Euro American involvement with the Piegans who were members of the Blackfeet Confederacy His research shows the tribe was trading furs for whiskey with the Hudson's Bay Company before Meriwether Lewis encountered them in 1806 As American fur traders and trappers moved into the region the U S government soon followed making treaties it did not honor When the gold rush started in the 1860s and the U S Army arrived pressure from Montana citizens to control the Piegans and make the territory safe led Generals William Tecumseh Sherman and Philip H Sheridan to send Baker and the 2nd Cavalry with tragic consequences Although these generals sought to dictate press coverage thereafter news of the cruelty of the killings appeared in the New York Times which called the massacre a more shocking affair than the sacking of Black Kettle's camp on the Washita two years earlier While other scholars have written about the Baker Massacre in related contexts Blood on the Marias gives this infamous event the definitive treatment it deserves Baker's inept command lit the spark of violence but decades of tension between Piegans and whites set the stage for a brutal and too often forgotten incident **Calaveras Gold** Ronald H.

Wise,2016 In *Producing Predators* Michael D Wise argues that contestations between Native and non Native people over hunting labor and the livestock industry drove the development of predator eradication programs in Montana and Alberta from the 1880s onward The history of these anti predator programs was significant not only for their ecological effects but also for their enduring cultural legacies of colonialism in the Northern Rockies By targeting wolves and other wild carnivores for extermination cattle ranchers disavowed the predatory labor of raising domestic animals for slaughter representing it instead as productive work Meanwhile federal agencies sought to purge the Blackfoot Salish Kootenai and other indigenous peoples of their so called predatory behaviors through campaigns of assimilation and citizenship that forcefully privatized tribal land and criminalized hunting and its related ritual practices Despite these colonial pressures Native communities resisted and negotiated the terms of their dispossession by representing their own patterns of work food and livelihood as productive By exploring predation and production as fluid cultural logics for valuing labor rather than just a set of biological processes *Producing Predators* offers a new perspective on the history of the American West and the modern history of colonialism more broadly Great Plains Research ,1997 **Illegal**
