DEFINITIONS OF POVERTY

Absolute Poverty

Absolute poverty is defined as an individual and/or household lacking the money or resources for basic life necessities. According to the United Nations (2005) "Absolute poverty is a condition characterised by severe deprivation of basic human needs, including food, safe drinking water, sanitation facilities, health, shelter, education and information".

This definition enables comparison poverty levels between nations, as the minimum income need for survival varies from country to country.

Relative Poverty

Relative poverty is when an individual and/or household receive 50% of the average household income. One key difference between absolute and relative poverty is relative poverty can be changeable depending on economic growth. Department of Work and Pensions data showed that 14.4 million people (22%) in the UK were living in relative poverty after housing costs in 2012/13 (UK Parliament, 2015).

Relative poverty can often be permanent with the majority of individuals never being able to enjoy a higher standard of living as others, due to the exclusion of clean clothes,

safe and appropriate housing, and access to the internet and/or a telephone, all necessities for an individual to find and maintain a job.

MEASURES OF POVERTY



Persistent Poverty - Characterises a household that has experienced being below the poverty line for two out of the past three years.

Household 50% below average income

- Also known as MBS, this measurement is defined by earning below 50% of the UK's average household income. This takes into account different household sizes as well as disposable income from benefits and taxes.

Absolute low income - This creates a threshold for the percentage of the UK average income each year. This is variable due to factors such as inflation.
