basic coverage of Wilsons disease Dr Brewer devotes an entire chapter to answering some of the most commonly asked questions about copper Many of these questions are unrelated to Wilsons disease but are questions frequently asked by other types of patients as they are informed that there is something wrong with their copper After that Dr Brewer explores the symptoms which should trigger the suspicion of Wilsons disease and what screening tests can be done to explore this possibility He then covers testing which will give a definitive diagnosis what the results of different tests mean and some of the possible problems with various tests which might be performed Once a reliable diagnosis of Wilsons disease is made anticopper therapy is essential to the survival of Wilsons disease patients Dr Brewer explains what drugs are available for treatment of Wilsons disease and offers a comparison of their benefits and side effects He elaborates on variations in treatment first discussing the initial stage of treatment and then long term maintenance therapy Included in the discussion are tips for treatment of children and pregnant women The risks and long term outlook for a person diagnosed with Wilsons disease are discussed in some detail After these information packed chapters Dr Brewer devotes a chapter to answering some frequently asked questions about Wilsons disease and presents resources available to Wilsons disease patients and their families The book concludes as Dr Brewer examines the current shortcomings in Wilsons disease therapy and points to areas which might be improved upon in the future Neurogenetics David R.
