the Oxford English Dictionary and Eric Partridge's Dictionary of Slang and Unconventional English frequently disagree on the matter. Dent includes as colloquial a great deal that purists might question or disallow. For the most part this work provides raw useful data for Ulysses critics and scholars but it rarely attempts to perform the work of literary critics. It will make users aware both of new information and of information already available in such reference works as the recently revised OED for many users not readily accessible. Like the OED itself it is necessarily a work in progress especially in its efforts to provide pre Ulysses evidence but it is abundantly useful in its present state. Most entries supplement and many correct entries in its principal predecessor. Don Gifford's Ulysses Annotated Colloquial Language in Ulysses attempts to include all colloquial expressions on which Gifford is seriously inadequate, questionable or demonstrably mistaken and all on which the 1988 edition differs substantially from the earlier edition of 1974.

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Billy Budd, Sailor and Selected Tales Herman Melville, 2009-02-26

Truth uncompromisingly told will always have its ragged edges. So wrote Melville of Billy Budd, Sailor among the greatest of his works and in its richness and ambiguity among the most problematic. As the critic E. L. Grant Watson writes: In this short history of the impressment and hanging of a handsome sailor boy are to be discovered problems as profound as those which puzzle us in the pages of the Gospels. Outwardly a compelling narrative of events aboard a British man of war during the turmoil of the Napoleonic Wars, Billy Budd, Sailor is a nautical recasting of the Fall, a parable of good and evil, a meditation on justice and political governance and a searching portrait of three extraordinary men. The passion it has aroused in its readers over the years is a measure of how deeply it addresses some of the fundamental questions of experience that every age must reexamine for itself. The selection in this volume represents the best of Melville's shorter fiction and uses the most authoritative texts. The eight shorter tales included here were composed during Melville's years as a magazine writer in the mid 1850s and establish him along with Hawthorne and Poe as the greatest American story writer of his age. Several of the tales, Bartleby the Scrivener, Benito Cereno, The Encantadas, The Paradise of Bachelors and the Tartarus of Maids, are acknowledged masterpieces of their genres. All show Melville a master of irony, point of view and tone whose fables ripple out in nearly endless circles of meaning.

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Little Dorrit Charles Dickens, 1999-07-15

Highly regarded today as one of the greatest novels in English literature, *Little Dorrit* presents both a scathing indictment of mid-Victorian England and a devastating insight into the human condition. Examining the many social and mental prisons which incarcerate men and women, the novel also considers the nature of true spiritual freedom. who inherits a fortune and his devoted daughter's love for a man who believes he has done with love. He draws widely on the events of his own life and times yet focuses a powerful imaginative vision which is as universal as it is specific, immediate and intense. How Novels Work John Mullan, 2008-02-14. Never has contemporary fiction been more widely discussed and passionately analysed. Recent years have seen a huge growth in the number of reading groups and in the interest of a non-academic readership in the discussion of how novels work. Drawing on his weekly *Guardian* column *Elements of Fiction*, John Mullan examines novels mostly of the last ten years, many of which have become firm favourites with reading groups.
