Lee, 2013-10-08 A volume on second language acquisition theory and pedagogy is at the same time a mark of progress and a bit of an anomaly The progress is shown by the fact that the two disciplines have established themselves as areas of study not only distinct from each other but also different from linguistic theory. This was not always the case at least not in the United States The anomaly results from the fact that this book deals with the relationship between L2 theory and pedagogy despite the conclusion that there is currently no widely accepted theory of SLA Grouped into five sections the papers in this volume consider questions about L2 theory and pedagogy at the macro level from the standpoint of the L2 setting consider input in terms of factors which are internal to the learner examine the question of external factors affecting the input such as the issue of whether points of grammar can be explicitly taught deal with questions of certain complex linguistic behaviors and the various external and social variables that influence learners and discuss issues surrounding the teaching of pronunciation factors that affect a non native accent The Acquisition of English Grammar and Phonology by Cantonese ESL Learners Alice Yin Wa Chan, 2022-12-30 Chan's exploration of the acquisition of English grammar and phonology by Cantonese learners of English as a Second Language ESL offers insights into the specific challenges that learners often encounter and posits ways to help them overcome those challenges Possible sources of the challenges are also examined The book covers the basic differences between English and Cantonese grammar as well as those between English and Cantonese phonology Chan discusses the kinds of grammatical and phonological problems that Cantonese ESL learners often have in their acquisition of English In terms of grammar various structures are reviewed including errors which are clearly due to L1 interference and also those which may not be directly L1 related Learners common misconceptions about relevant concepts are also revealed In terms of phonology both speech perception and speech production problems at the segmental and suprasegmental levels are examined For learner problems which may be the result of L1 interference a contrastive approach is adopted in analysing the cause and nature of the errors Chan also offers readers pedagogical insights to target common grammatical problems including the use of an algorithmic approach the use of a discovery based consciousness raising approach and the use of metalinguistic explanations As far as the learning of English phonology is concerned she argues that the training of speech production should go hand in hand with that of speech perception Future research can experiment with the proposed teaching ideas with Cantonese ESL learners and learners of other native languages Researchers and ESL teaching professionals will find the insights and research contained within this volume invaluable when encountering or researching Chinese ESL learners Foundational Principles of Task-Based Language Teaching Martin East, 2021-06-30 This book is available Open Access This book introduces readers to the concept of task based language teaching TBLT a learner centred and experiential approach to language teaching and learning Based on the premise that language learners can enhance their second language acquisition SLA through engagement in communicative tasks that compel them to use language for themselves TBLT stands in contrast to more traditional approaches Accessible and
