Well Child Annual exam SOAP Note

CC: Well infant 4-month checkup.

HPI: This is Jackie a 4-month-old girl. Jackie presents to the office today with her mother, Pam. She states she is here for her daughter's 4-month checkup, and she is doing well overall, but mother is concerned about diaper rash when using 'Pampers' diapers, specifically. Mother states the rash is contained within the diaper area, and just gets worse when her diaper is on for extended time. Mother states she is using Desitin A/D cream and Pittsburgh butt-paste, she uses both interchangeably, and they both work well to control the rash. They have tried Luvs, and Huggies both types of diapers seem to not irritate the diaper area like the Pampers do. Otherwise, there are no other health concerns for Jackie at this visit.

PAST MEDICAL HISTORY

Birth History: Pam was 34 y/o female when she delivered at 39 weeks gestation (G2P2). Mother had appropriate prenatal care, went to all visits starting at 8 weeks, and did not have any complications with pregnancy nor delivery. Jackle was a vaginal delivery with an APGAR score of 10. She weighed 8to and 8oz at birth. Baby was healthy at birth, and her neonatal period only complicated by some jaundice that was treated out-patient (increased breastfeeds and sat her near window for some natural sunlight). They also did go into see doctors a few times per mother, because they believed they heard a mumnur, and they wanted to continue to monitor.

Developmental History: Age-appropriate milestones met, no concerns at this time (child is tracking/studying watching, very infatuated with older brother and family dog). She also does plenty of tummy time throughout the day, grabs at feet, turning head to noises, and lots of smiles, babbles, and coos.

Childhood Illness: Occasional stuffy nose no serious illnesses, no chronic health conditions. No hospitalizations, accidents, consults, or therapies noted.

Speech and communication: Appropriate babbles and coos, and responses to family Nutrition: 24 hour def recall infant currently only getting BM from breast and bottle. Fixes: 3-4 for bottles throughout the day and 4-5 at breast feeding sessions, lasting 10-15 min each. Special diets: Mother avoids cruciferous foods to avoid gassiness.

Eluoride treatment: No dentition at this time.

HEALTH MAINTENANCE

Immunizations: Right on track

Allergies: No known allergies to medications, food, environment, or substances.

Medications: Not currently taking any Rx, or herbal supplements., Occasional Children's Acetaminophen without dies if in pain from teething. Taking daily Vitamin D ggts 400 IMU.

Oral health: notices gums are red and swollen- giving frozen wet cloth and sometimes teethers.

Hearing and vision screening: Jackie passed her newborn hearing screen. No concerns with her vision.

Sleep habits: Sleeping in own crib in own room with a monitor, no pillows or blankets in crib and sleeps up to 6 hours at night, and 2-3 1-hour naps during the day.

Safety: Mother states she feels safe at home, and lives in a safe neighborhood. Father is a police officer and has a gun that is kept locked away in a safe.

Temperament: Mother states Jackie is easily consolable by rocking holding.

FAMILY AND SOCIAL HISTORY

Family History: Maternal grandfather. Type II diabetes; Paternal grandmother. Hypothyroidism and Type II diabetes; Pat grandfather- Hyperlipidemia, and HTN Mom denies any other significant family hx.

Social History: Jackie lives at home with her mother and father who are married, and has a 3-year-old brother max. Their home was built around 1978, but doesn't have peeling, old paint. So isn't believed to
