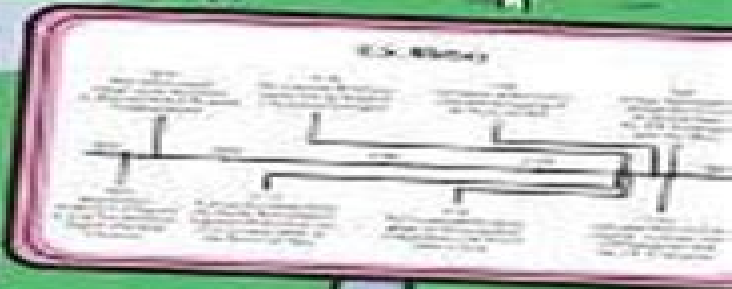
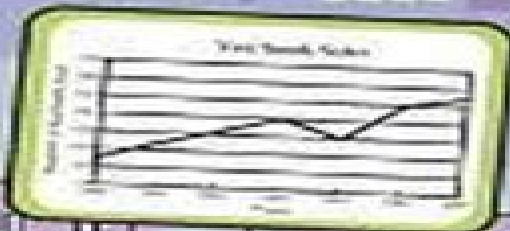
Chapter 1: The Information Age
